The tickets for the second edition of Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) will be sold at Premier Bank counters in three cities from today. The online sale has already begun yesterday at www.easy.com.bd and www.activeservices.net.

Twenty-one branches of the bank -- 17 in Dhaka, two in Chittagong and one in Khulna -- will sell the tickets.

The lowest-priced ticket for a day's play -two matches -- has been set at Tk 350 and each person will be allowed to buy two tickets a day. Students and Airtel users will receive a 30 per cent discount upon presentation of their ID card or SIM card.

Officials of Active

Services, the company that bought the ticketing rights of the T20 competition, informed that 30 per cent of the tickets will be sold through Airtel's mobile network, another 30 per cent through banks, 10 per cent will be available online and 10 per cent will be sold at the venues. The remaining 20 per cent have been reserved for officials of the Bangladesh Cricket Board.

Their most expensive buy, Mushfiqur Rahim, who was bought for 205,000 dollars, has been given the responsibility to lead a side that has a good mix of players. Sylhet have had to find a couple of replacements on their side right before the competition as the

West Indian duo of Tino Best and Andre Russel will be touring Australia in February and are unavailable. They have been replaced with Australian Dirk Nannes and West Indian Shivnarine Chanderpaul, both

of whom were initially unsold in the players' auctions.

KEYPLAYERS

While Mushfiqur may not exactly follow the 'slam-wham-bang' theory with the bat, he does, however, clear the park with ease when set. The captain of the national team, Mushfiqur knows the strengths and weaknesses of most of the local players. It'll be a plus point for the captain, who will be leading a comparatively inexperienced T20 side. Shohag Gazi has seen his

value increase by a huge margin in a year's time. From being in the 'Group C' in last year's auctions, to being catapulted into the same category as that of Mashrafe Bin Mortaza, Shohag's performances against the West Indies has done wonders for him. While he did excel in 50 overs cricket and the five-day version of the game, he still needs to get experienced in the shortest format of the game. He, along with Suhrawardi Shuvo, will have to lead the spin department for the Royals. Known as a T20 specialist, Nannes is perhaps the

> most experienced player in the Sylhet side. His late entry into the team is bound to strengthen Sylhet's bowling attack.

STRONG POINT

The Royals this year are a more balanced side as compared to last year's team. While their bowling attack has a good balance between spin and pace, their batting side has a mix of aggression and caution. Dwayne Smith, Hamilton Masakadza and Mominul Haque, apart from the captain, will be expected to bat at the top-order.

The 32nd National Badminton Championships get underway tomorrow at the Shaheed Tajuddin Ahmed Indoor Stadium sans Bangladesh Biman.

The national flag career has been a dominant force in the age-old event but will miss the colourful indoor sport for the first time after being associated with it for over 34 years.

The no-show is part of a sagging Biman Bangladesh's policy of a gradual withdrawal from domestic sport on financial grounds. They did not form the women's team in the ongoing Table Tennis League, their cricket team had been relegated to the First Division last season while their mediocre chess team only managed to stay at the Premier Division following Biman Bangladesh's decision not to patronise any sport teams.

"Last year, the board had decided not to sponsor its different sports teams as they can't bear the expenses. And that is why Biman is not taking part in the national badminton championships this time," said Biman's former badminton manager Noor Islam yesterday.

Biman has been taking part in any badminton meets since 1979 and have won a total of 27 singles titles in both men's and women's events.

"We are very disappointed with such decision," said 2010 national champion

Mohammad Rois Uddin who played for Biman for the last 10 years.

"Every player dreams to play for Biman, who pays handsomely. Their withdrawal will adversely affect the game," said Rois who joined Bangladesh Railway this year.

"Biman is still managing its cricket team but they have decided to part ways with badminton. It's unfortunate. It needs a lot of money to run a cricket team. But one can easily form a badminton team with an amount of money that can buy only a cricketer like Mashrafee (Bin Morataza)."

Ahsan Habib Parash, who won six consecutive men's singles tiles for Biman, hoped that Biman would return to badminton again for the betterment of the

A total of 262 shuttlers including 35 women from six divisions, 54 districts, three educational boards and one organisation are taking part in the meet, sponsored by Internet provider Qubee.

The championships feature five events men's singles and doubles, women's singles and doubles and mixed doubles.

Bangladesh Badminton Federation general secretary Jobaidur Rahman Rana, at a pre-event press meet, informed that all rating players including no-rated but former champions Enayetullah Khan are taking part in the meet. He also said that they are offering a cash award of over Taka one lakh for the winners.

Badminton sans Biman Novak chasing treble

Year's first Open begins today

Novak Djokovic bids for an

unprecedented third straight Australian Open title from Monday, with growing rival Andy Murray and the great Roger Federer shaping as his biggest challenges.

Argentina's Juan Martin Del Potro is the only man besides Djokovic, Rafael Nadal, Federer and Murray to win a Grand Slam tournament since 2005, but the Serb said there were plenty of others who could threaten their dominance.

However, the odds favour Djokovic who is targeting a third straight Australian title, a feat which has not been achieved in the professional era.

Nadal is not playing due to illness, robbing Melbourne Park of a repeat of last year's epic final, when Djokovic finally tamed the Spaniard at 1:40 am after a record, 5hr 53min final which left him with bleeding toes.

But Djokovic will face a stiff challenge from the newly assertive Murray, fresh from his first Grand Slam win and keen to avenge his final and semifinal defeats to Djokovic in Melbourne in 2011 and 2012.

Also pressing hard will be Federer, holder of an unmatched 17 Grand Slams and still hungry for more even

him up perfectly to build on the best year of his career.

Murray, the world number three, was thrashed by Djokovic in the 2011
