Modhu, Masum, Razzak, Mozammel, Yer Ali, and Masud, were handed over to Bangladeshi immigration police by Indian BSF.



2ND PHASE OF IJTEMA BEGINS

Lakhs join Juma prayers

The second phase of Biswa Ijtema, the second largest Muslim congregation after hajj, began yesterday after the morning's Fazr prayers with a religious sermon by Indian Islamic scholar Moulana Md Ismail Hossain.

This is the third year that the Ijtema is being held in two phases on the banks of Turag in Tongi, around 20 kilometres off the capital, to enable smooth management and security checks.

The second phase will conclude tomorrow with final supplication --Akheri Munajat. The first phase was held from January 11 to 13.

The venue turned into a sea of people as lakhs of devotees, including around 2,500 from 77 countries, arrived for yesterday's Juma prayers, led by Maulana Qwari Zobayer, imam of Kakrail mosque.

Like in the first phase, several hundred women arrived at the Ijtema grounds, renting adjoining houses and shops for a place to sit and take part in the prayers.

The gathering spilled over to adjoining areas with a huge number of devotees performing the prayers on the streets and many more on the roofs of buses and buildings because of a shortage of space on the 160-acre grounds.

Vehicular movement on Dhaka-Mymensingh Highway was halted for over one hour due to the devotees praying on the road.

Four devotees died of old age complications and cardiac arrest on Thursday.

They are Nazir Ahmed, 56, of Hossainpur in Comilla; Badhon Fakir, 70, of Tongipara of Gopalganj; Shamsu Haque, 70, of Sonadanga of Khulna; and Afzal Hossian, 60, of Bogra.

Over nine different organisations are providing free healthcare services by setting up medical camps near the Ijtema grounds. Police, Rapid Action Battalion and

intelligence agency members, in uniform and plainclothes, have set up a multi-layer security system to avoid any untoward incident. Mobile courts of Gazipur district administration fined shop and restau-

COLLEGE TEACHER ABDUCTION

Four JU students expelled

The Jahangirnagar University (JU) authorities have expelled four students and suspended their studentship in connection with abducting a college lecturer. They are Jabir Hossain of anthropology department;

Safiq and Anisuzzaman Siddiqi of history department; Shahed Shah of philosophy department. Rubel Islam, student of Dhaka College Islamic studies

department, was also allegedly involved in the incident. The five were put on a three-day police remand on Wednesday following a Dhaka court order on Tuesday.

The expulsion decision was taken at a meeting on Thursday afternoon, said JU Registrar Abu Bakkar Siddique.

A four-member probe committee, led by Prof Aminul Islam, was also formed to investigate the incident. Sources said Md Ahsan Habib, a lecturer of Alhajj Selima

Rahman Vocational College, Sundarganj upazila of Gaibandha, was abducted allegedly by the five from the capital's Shikkha Bhaban on January 11.

Habib alleged Jabir confined him to Al Beruni and ASM Kamal Uddin halls of JU and, later, the five demanded a ransom of Tk 10 lakh from his wife.

On information from Habib's wife, Rab-4 arrested them on January 14 when the five came to Karotoya Courier Service in Savar to receive the money sent by the woman. Later, Rab rescued Habib.

During interrogation by Rab, the students alleged that the teacher borrowed the money from them for business purpose but did not paid in time.

The five were handed over to Savar Model Police Station on January 14.

BODY FOUND IN TRAIN Buying house

The man who was found dead in a toilet of a train in the capital's Kamalapur Railway Station early Thursday was strangled, reveals autopsy report.

The deceased was identified as Moniruzzaman Bablu, 45, of Tilpapara in Khilgaon, He worked at a buying house in Uttara. Bablu's nephew, Raqibul Islam Chanchal, identified the body at Dhaka Medical College morgue yesterday noon.

Chanchal said his uncle went missing on Wednesday night while he was returning home from his office.

He also said Bablu had a mobile phone, some cash and a bag with him, however, police did not find anything from the body.

Meanwhile, Matiur Rahman, father of Sadia Islam Rita, who was found decapitated at her Mirpur residence early Thursday, told this correspondent that Rita was beheaded by her husband, Manik Mia Bepari.

Rita worked as a computer-operator at a private firm in Mirpur and her husband used to suspect that she was having an affair with her colleague, said Matiur, adding that Manik might have killed his daughter because of the suspicion.
