



TO MALAYSIA BY BOAT

37 desperados held by Rab

Rapid Action Battalion yesterday detained 37 people including eight Rohingyas at a hotel in Cox's Bazar when they were about to start for Malaysia illegally "on a motorboat".

Three middlemen involved in the planning of the journey -- Md Kamal, Abdul Gaffar and hotel manager Nurul Alam -- have also been held, said Rab-7 Camp Leader Major Sarwar-e-Alam.

Acting on a tip-off, a Rab team raided hotel Mohammadia Resort in Kolatoli area in the city around 1:00am and held them there, said the major. The detainees had been staying in three rooms at the

hotel since mid-January, the major said. They are all job seekers from Bogra, Satkhira, Jessore,

Kushtia, Chittagong and Cox's Bazar. Ataur Rahman, one of the victims from Bogra, said he was contacted by a local broker named Hashem, who promised him a well-paid job in Malaysia in exchange for

The victims were waiting for a call from a person known only as Alam. He was supposed to call and let them know the boat was ready, said the major.

Sharmin and her younger brother Sujon had been working for Smart Export for the last six months. Sujon has narrowly escaped

Extradition treaty to have refusal clause

Signing after Indian home minister arrives today

Bangladesh and India are expected to ink two crucial deals including an extradition treaty during a home ministerial meeting in the capital today.

Indian Home Minister Sushilkumar Shinde, who is set to arrive this morning by a special flight on a two-day visit,

would sit for a meeting with his Bangladesh counterpart Muhiuddin Khan Alamgir at 2:30pm.

The two ministers would sit for talks after a meeting of the Bangladesh cabinet approves the draft of the extradition treaty. The Indian cabinet on Thursday approved the treaty on its part.

Steered by stars

The humble dung beetle is the first insect known to navigate by the stars. Like sailors of old and Saharan nomads, it can orientate itself by watching the sky.

On clear nights, a myriad of stars shine over the deserts and savannahs of Africa where the dung beetle, or scarab, makes its home. While the beetle's compound eyes are probably too weak to see individual stars, it uses the light of the Milky Way to keep it on a straight course, scientists have found.
