

Like Shahina, thousands of enthusiastic spectators had to wait in the queue outside the MA Aziz Stadium while thousands others enjoyed the first match from the stands.

Around 3pm, the spectator pressure was so high in the Eastern Gallery that the organisers had to open the gates to the club galleries, grand stands and the international stand. However, many spectators alleged that the organisers sold more tickets than the capacity of the ground.

AZM Nasir Uddin, venue chairman, also General Secretary of Chittagong Jela Krira Sangstha (CJKS) told The Daily Star that the cricket fans of the port city again proved that they know how to enjoy the game in the environment of a cricket ground.

Expressing his gratitude to the spectators especially to the young cricket fans, Nasir opined that the presence would again inspire all the partners and investors involved in the game and this will see the beginning of a new phase of BPL.

Nasir said, around 26,000 tickets were sold for the first day's matches.

Meanwhile, Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) sources said, CCC will distribute more than 8,000 tickets to the school students for the upcoming matches, spending money from its own fund.


