Trouble at MA Aziz

While the Chittagong leg of the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) T20 has seen an upturn in the tournament's image with capacity crowds turning up to support their teams, the huge spectator interest created some problems during yesterday's matches at the MA Aziz Stadium.

Hundreds of fans had to watch the matches standing and sitting on the aisles as the galleries were unable to contain the rush. The crowd pressure was so great that in the evening, tensions ran high among the spectators in the scramble for seats in the North gallery.

Some of the personnel responsible for controlling entry claimed that over 35,000 spectators got into the stadium, the capacity of which is 25,000.

Member of the ticket distributing committee Omar Goni Chowdhury told The Daily Star that all tickets were sold two days before. "For the last day's matches around 22,000 tickets have been sold," he said. "The non-ticket holders entered through the gates 1 and 18."

"We conveyed the matter to the law enforcers," he said, adding that the committee have nothing to do with ticket checking or gate-keeping.

Mohan is not a player, not even a spectator. But nowadays his life is intertwined with cricket. He rejoices when the matches draw huge crowds to the ground,

although he is yet to enter a stadium to enjoy live cricket. Even as over 25,000 cricket fans were supporting their teams in the Duronto Rajshahi-Barishal Burners match in the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) T20 at Chittagong's MA Aziz Stadium yesterday afternoon,

Mohan was busy with his job outside the stadium walls.

A vendor who started his business during the 2011 World Cup hosted in Bangladesh, Mohan came to the port city with 14 friends to sell his products which include team flags, jerseys, caps and hand-made flutes and vari ous others that add to the spectators' joy when they are watching the cricket.

Owais Shah has clarified the delay in the 25 per cent of his 75,000-dollar payment was because of an error in the bank details he had provided. He had initially complained about not being paid despite receiving a remittance slip from the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) and had termed the situation "embarrassing" for the board.

"In regards to my initial payment of 25 per cent, the issue has been rectified," Shah said in an email sent via his agent. "Initially, the bank details I provided to the BCB didn't seem to go through properly which was unfortunate. It resulted in the delay but the BCB have acted very efficiently and I'm now happy with where things stand, which is great."

BCB's acting chief executive Nizamuddin Chowdhury said Shah's reaction was "premature" as the payments often take a few extra days to process. The bank had confirmed on Thursday that the transfer of the amount was not possible without the correct IBAN (International Bank Account Number).

"A player of Owais Shah's reputation gave a premature reaction in the public domain. This is regrettable," Chowdhury told ESPNcricinfo. "Our bank sent us a correspondence on Thursday that the IBAN was incorrect and hence, his agent provided us with the information again and we had to make the transfer once again.
