Sony rescues Russel

Haitian playmaker Sony Norde scored two crucial goals and created two

more as Sheikh Russel KC came from two goals down to beat Team BJMC 4-3 in a pulsating encounter of the Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier League at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

The 23-year old Haitian's exploits helped Sheikh Russel regain the lead in the table, albeit for two hours, with 22 points from nine matches. They were later overtaken by Abahani who handed a 2-0 defeat to Arambagh KS. Team BJMC meanwhile stayed at sixth position with 12 points.

The focus was on Sheikh Russel's old warrior Alamu Bukola, who returned to the fold yesterday after being bought in the mid-season transfer window. The Nigerian striker though could not provide the services his team needed, and Sheikh Russel had to turn to Sony for inspiration after going two goals down inside the first 15 minutes.

Eleta Kingsley gave BJMC the lead in

the fifth with a close range drive before Taklis Ahmed doubled the margin with a tap-in, nine minutes later.

Sheikh Russel slowly started to get their game right, with Sony spearheading the attack, and the Haitian twice came close to reducing the lead, only to be thwarted by BJMC goalkeeper Aminul Haque.

But his persistence paid off after the break as conjured up a wonderful goal in the 55th minute with a solo effort from a counter attack. Having received the ball from the midfield, Sony ran down the left towards the goal, and seeing BJMC goalkeeper Aminul Haque on that post, Sony cleverly swung the ball to find the back of net after hitting the far post.

Two minutes later, Sony drove a powerful shot from outside the box which Aminul could only manage to parry towards Zahid's path, who needed a simple tap-in.

Sony gave Sheikh Russel the lead in the 64th minute with a curling effort from outside the box on a short pass from Zahid which gave Aminul no chance to react.

The lead lasted only two minutes as Guinean striker Ismael Bangoura headed in a fierce-drive from Abul Hossain to

bring BJMC back in the match. But as the clock was ticking down,

The Sri Lankan, however, hasn't yet been given the notice to remain with the side for the T20 world cup which will take place in 2014.
