Dutch coaches Lodewijk de Kruif and Rene Koster have left the Bangladesh Football Federation in a quandary by attaching some preconditions to their interim stint in charge of the national team during the AFC Challenge Cup Qualifiers, which will be held in Nepal from March 2 to 6.


The two were supposed to take charge of the national team on February 20 and conduct training before flying for Nepal on February 25 to compete against hosts Nepal, Palestine and Northern Mariana Island but some preconditions they attached has made BFF have a second thought about them.

"When we spoke with their agent the day before yesterday, everything seemed settled. But yesterday (Saturday) they attached some new conditions where the coaches will have the right to cancel the agreement while the federation will have no such right. Another major concern is that they may send a third coach in case neither of them can come. Furthermore, they have demanded that they will have to be paid by February 12," said BFF president Kazi Salahuddin yesterday.

The demonstrations at the Shahbagh intersection, now popularly known as the 'Projonmo Chottor', was notched up by a few degrees yesterday afternoon when various members of the national cricket team along with the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) president and other members paid a visit to showcase their support.

Thousands of people cheered relentlessly as the cricketers, led by national captain Mushfiqur Rahim took the podium at the intersection at approximately 1:30 pm. Mashrafe Bin Mortaza, Abdur Razzak, Mohammad Ashraful and Nasir Hossain joined Rahim at the podium. The presence of the national heroes audibly lifted spirits and the focus of the entire crowd shifted to them as they showed solidarity with the movement.

Apart from Farashganj, Chittagong Abahani, Rahmatganj MFS, and Dhaka United SC, formerly known as Beanibazar SC, will be trying to get back to the top-tier but will have to face some challenge from other four teams - Victoria SC, Wari Club, Uttar Baridhara Club and Agrani Bank SC, who are also considered good sides

regarding their last season's results. "This time the clubs have found a lot of players from the Senior Division League,

Pioneer League and BFF Development program and we hope the league will be very competitive like ongoing Bangladesh Premier League," said BFF senior vice president Abdus Salam Murshedy at a press conference at the BFF House yesterday.

Except for Chittagong Abahani, all seven clubs selected Birshreshtha Shaheed Mostafa Kamal Stadium in Kamalapur as their home venue as the league will be run on home and away

Salam informed that top two finishers of the league will be promoted to the Bangladesh Premier League while one team will be relegated to their respective

league they came from. Sponsors Premier Bank will provide Tk 20 lakh, all of which will be distributed among the participating teams.

According to the BFF calendar, the Bangladesh Championship League was supposed to be completed by February 25, but the BFF deferred the league numerous times citing different reasons.
