# 18 killed in bus crash

At least 18 people were killed and 25 others injured as a bus fell on the bank of the river Matamuhuri from a bridge on Chittagong-Cox's Bazar highway in Chakaria upazila early yesterday.

The bus was carrying around 46 passengers, who after attending an urs [religious congregation] at Maizbhander shrine in Fatikchhari, Chittagong decided to have a picnic on the beach in Cox's Bazar.

The passengers were all from Noagaon and Harinala areas of Gazipur municipality and were in Chittagong to attend the congregation, said Cox's Bazar Deputy Commissioner Mohammad Ruhul Amin.

Sixteen of the passengers died on the spot while two succumbed to their injuries in Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) and Chakaria upazila health complex, said Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Jainal Abdin of Chakaria, adding that a total of 12 males and six females died in the accident.

Of the deceased, three had been identified as Abul Kashem, Abdur Rashid, 50, and Rajib, 26, said Assistant Superintendent of Police Khaleduzzaman of Cox's Bazar (Sadar circle).

Our Gazipur correspondent reports: Five family members of Lal Miah of Noagaon also died in the accident. They are: Lal Miah's wives Joynab Begum, 65, and Mofiza Akhter, 45, his daughter Sheuli Akhter, 14, brother Abdur Rashid, 50 and brother-in-law Abdul Jalil, 55.


