#### Rapist gets life term in jail

A Dhaka court yesterday sentenced a rapist to life term rigorous imprisonment in a case filed for raping a 10-year-old schoolgirl in the capital's Jurain area on October 22 last year.

The court also fined 22-year-old Mohammad Al-Amin, Tk 1 lakh which will be handed over to the victim's family as compensation after realisa-

According to the prosecution, Al-Amin forcefully picked up the schoolgirl when she was on her way to Al-Hera mosque and raped her beneath the

## Eleven more bodies of victims arrive

Thirty-five-year-old Rina Begum first visited Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport in Dhaka to see off his husband Anwar Hossain two years ago. She visited the airport for the second time yesterday--

this time to receive Anwar as a dead man. Anwar of Comilla was among 19 Bangladeshis who were killed in a road crash in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) on February 4. His body arrived at the airport along with those of 10 other victims yesterday.

Rina, a mother of three little girls, said her husband went to the UAE spending around Tk 4 lakh, which was collected on loans. Anwar could not pay off the debts, she said. "I do not know how to pay the debts and run the family now."

Mukta Begum, who came to receive the body of her husband, Bashar Shaikh Alif, from Munshiganj, was too shocked to talk as journalists approached her.

The response came from Shilpi Begum wife of Bashar's elder brother. "My brother (Bashar) told me on Sunday, the day before the accident, 'please, do not quarrel and look after my daughters'," she

Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Minister Khandker Mosharraf Hossain handed the bodies over to their families at the airport.

The other victims are Shahjahan Mollah and Rokon Munshi of Faridpur, Mohammed Faruk and Md Faruq Hossain of Laxmipur, Noor Alam and Habibur Rahman of Comilla, Joynal Kobiraj of Rajbari, and Uzzal Miah of Netrakona.

The minister distributed cheques for Tk 35,000 to each of the victim families as burial cost and said the government would provide Tk 2 lakh more to each of the families later.

On Sunday, seven bodies arrived in Chittagong. The body of the last victim, Wasir Ali, will arrive in Sylhet today.

## Ctg city, RU observe silence for 3 minutes

From workplace to home, tens of thousands of people from all walks of life rose to their feet at 4:00pm and fell silent for the next three minutes in Chittagong city and Rajshahi University yesterday. They were demanding, in silence, execution of all convicted war criminals, including jailed Jamaat-e-Islami leader Abdul Quader Mollah.

On Chittagong Press Club premises where anti-war criminal activists have been staging protests for the last seven days, the crowd grew larger and larger two or three hours before 4:00pm, reports our correspondents from Chittagong.

Students from Chittagong University, Chittagong Medical College, and other educational institutions of the port city joined the silence in masses. As soon as the clock struck 4:03pm, protesters broke into loud shouts of slogans again. The silence was also observed in front of Chittagong

Custom House. Around 1,000 people and professionals joined it. People also observed the programme at Prabartak intersection and in Mehedibagh area separately.

On Rajshahi University campus where the anti-war criminal sit-in entered its sixth day yesterday, the threeminute silence programme was held at Tukitaki Chattar, reports our RU correspondent.

#### Country's first female paratrooper gets her badge

Capt Zannatul Ferdous has become the first successful female paratrooper in Bangladesh.

Along with 17 others, Zannatul completed the special paratrooper course by jumping off a helicopter of Bangladesh Air Force from a height of 1,000 feet yesterday.

They jumped off the helicopter near Jalalabad Cantonment in Sylhet.

"It is very thrilling, I want to jump off again," said an animated Zannatul upon landing. "Other female colleagues should come forward now. I was scared in the beginning but after finishing the course it has become easier," she added.

Hailing from Bishnupur in Brahmanbaria, Zannatul Ferdous joined Bangladesh Army in 2007 after being commissioned with the 59th batch. She is now serving as a computer trainer at Bangladesh Military Academy.

Lt Col Saiful Islam, chief trainer of the paratrooper course, said there is nothing to bar female officers from joining the paratrooper course. Zannatul's success will surely encourage other females in the army.

Commandant of the School of Infantry and Tactics Brig Gen Mahbubul Haque said it is a milestone for the army as Zannatul became the first female paratrooper.

### JAIL KILLING CASE

### Prosecution prays for justice

Anisul Huq, the principal state counsel for the jail killing case, yesterday prayed to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court for justice in the case.

He said the lower court and High Court in their verdicts ignored the charge of conspiracy to kill four national leaders in Dhaka Central Jail on November 3, 1975.

Anisul was citing statements of prosecution witnesses while placing arguments during a hearing before the Appellate Division. Yesterday was the sixth day of the hear-

ing on the government's appeal against the HC verdict that acquitted six former army personnel in the case. The six acquitted are Marfat Ali Shah, Abdul Hashem Mridha, Lt Col (dismissed)

Syed Farooq-ur Rahman, Lt Col (retd)

Sultan Shahriar Rashid Khan, Maj (retd)

Bazlul Huda and Maj (retd) AKM

Mohiuddin Ahmed.

However, Farooq, Shahriar, Bazlul Huda and Mohiuddin were executed in connection with Bangabandhu assassination case.

According to Anisul, the then president Khandaker Mushtaq Ahmed held a meeting with the accused of the jail killing case on November 2, 1975 night when the decision to kill the leaders was taken.

As per the decision, Risaldar (retd) Muslemuddin, Marfat and Hashem went to Dhaka Central Jail the next day to kill the leaders.

In 2004, Dhaka Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court sentenced the trio to death and 12 others to life for abetting the three in killing Syed Nazrul Islam, Tajuddin Ahmad, AHM Quamruzzaman and Capt Mansur Ali. In 2008, the HC upheld the capital punishment of Muslemuddin, but acquitted Marfat and Hashem.

#### ARSENIC 165 per 1 lakh exposed may die: Study

About 165 out of every 1 lakh people regularly exposed to arsenic contamination may die of cancer, found a research.

This rate is much lower than what experts anticipated in the early 90s, it added.

Dr M Abul Hasnat, senior lecturer of Centre for Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics of The University of Newcastle, Australia, presented the key findings at a dissemination programme organised by NGO Forum in the capital's Brac Centre Inn yesterday.

Titled "Cancer Morbidity and Mortality among Chronically Arsenic Exposed Population in Rural Bangladesh", the study included a total of 6,667 individuals from 1,428 households of four villages in Pabna, Chapainawabganj and Jhenidah.

Addressing the programme, State Minister for Health

and Family Welfare Capt (retd) Dr Mozibur Rahman Fakir

urged all development organisations to engage in arsenic

mitigation activities across the country. NGO Forum with the assistance of European Union conducted the research.
