# BCL men assault new principal

Activists of Chhatra League assaulted a newly-appointed principal at Barisal Government Brojo Mohan College (BM College) yesterday.

Prof Shankar Chandra Dutt was driven out of the campus by a rowdy band of BCL, BM College unit, led by its joint convenor Moin Tushar in the afternoon when he went there to take charge, witnesses and local people said. Moin Tushar, however, rejected the accusation and

claimed that his men had rescued Shankar instead and arranged for his safe exit from the campus.

Maksudul Alam Masud, joint convener of another faction of the BCL unit, alleged that the outgoing principal Prof Nani Gopal Das and a section of BCL men loyal to him had a role in the incident. They had been involved in corruption and admission trade and so want cancellation of the new appointment to keep their misdeeds from getting exposed.

#### WAR CRIMES TRIAL Appointment of 2 prosecutors put on hold

The government yesterday halted appointments of two new prosecutors of the International Crimes Tribunals around two hours after they were

given the job. State Minister for Law Qamrul Islam told The Daily Star his ministry had suspended the appointment "temporarily" to have their political backgrounds scrutinised.

The minister without giving details said the suspension order would be withdrawn soon.

The solicitor's office under the law ministry issued an order to appoint Barrister Hossain-e Manzur and Barrister Sanyan Rahman as prosecutors for the tribunals around 12noon. The same

# Witness testifies on abduction, torture

A prosecution witness yesterday narrated how he and two fellow freedom fighters were abducted and brutally tortured in front of Salauddin Quader Chowdhury and his father at Goods Hill, Chittagong, during the Liberation War.

In his deposition, 19th prosecution witness Syed Wahidul Alam Junu, 59, said seeing them SQ Chowdhury's father Fazlul Quader Chowdhury used swear words. Later, Pakistani army beat them up at Goods Hill, the home of the Chowdhury's.

Alam told the International Crimes

Tribunal-1 yesterday that the incident that took place from July 5 to July 13, 1971.

One of the two fellow freedom fighters: STAFF CORRESPONDENT Alam mentioned was Nizamuddin Ahmed, who testified last year against SQ Chowdhury, being tried for crimes against humanity committed during the 1971

## Submit charges against Mobarak on February 25

Tribunal asks prosecution

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 yesterday asked the prosecution to submit formal charges against "Awami Leaguer" Mobarak Hossain in connection with crimes against humanity committed during the Liberation War.


Mobarak, according to local politicians, was the organising secretary of a union unit of Awami League of Akhaura upazila in Brahmanbaria for 16 years. Fixing February 25 for submission of charges, the

tribunal, led by Justice ATM Fazle Kabir, yesterday extended Mobarak's bail until that day.

The suspect, who has been on bail since July 16 last year, appeared before the tribunal yesterday seeking bail extension.

On January 24, Tribunal-1 directed the prosecution to submit the formal charges against Mobarak yesterday.
