Tamim to miss rest of BPL

Tamim Iqbal looks set to miss the rest of the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) after suffering a 'hairline crack' on his left wrist. An MRI-scan yesterday revealed the extent of the damage and Duronto Rajshahi opener Tamim has been advised to stay out of sports for the next fourteen days ruling him out for the rest of the competition which will end on February 19.

Tamim sustained the injury while fielding in their BPL match against the Sylhet Royals last week. An immediate X-ray ruled out broken bones, but the MRI yesterday revealed that there are some concerns.

It isn't a fracture, so it's not a matter of grave concern. However, he needs to keep his left-arm at rest for the next two weeks at least," said Dr Debasish Dutta the Bangladesh physio. He however allayed fears that Tamim might not be fit before Bangladesh's tour of Sri Lanka in March.

Tamim himself was not unduly worried.

At 146 for 4, Rajshahi had the daunting task of scoring 48 runs off the last three

overs. The third ball of the 17th over saw Simon Katich (53) -- their mainstay -bowled by a slower delivery from Rubel Hossain and in the next over captain Chamara Kapugedera fell in his attempt to hit out.

Two sixes by Charles Coventry in the first overof Rajshahi's chase, bowled by Shaun Tait, raised hopes of a fighting response. Coventry continued to be the main aggressor for the first couple of overs before being bowled by Tait in the third over.

Sylhet's victory cuts the chase for the all important fourth spot between Duronto Rajshahi and the Rangpur Riders. Rangpur will go through only if they beat Barisal in today's game. If they fail, Rajshahi will

make it through, based on head to head wins.

With 47 runs required of the last six overs and seven wickets in hand, Sylhet were eyeing a comfortable victory. However, things changed as Royals suddenly lost crucial wickets of Mushfiqur Rahim (34) and Nazmul Hossain Milon (1) in the 16th over and the pressure was back on. It would have been worse had Alauddin Babu held on to a diving catch to get rid of Elton Chigumbura in the same

The 'pressure-game' continued between the teams as Sylhet required another 39 of the last four overs. Seven runs of the 17th over was followed by a six and a four in the first two balls of the 18th. Title contenders Sheikh Jamal DC's unbeaten run in the Grameenphone

Bangladesh Premier League came to an end yesterday when holders Abahai handed them a 1-0 defeat Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

A 20th-minute strike from in-form striker Shakhawat Hossin Rony gave Abahani all three points and ensured the four-time champions regained the lead in the league. Elsewhere, at the Sheikh Fazlul Haque Moni Stadium in Gopalganj, Rezaul Karim and Tareq El Janaby scored either side of the break to give visitors Sheikh Russel a much-needed victory over hosts Muktijoddha Sangsad 2-0.

The two results meant Sheikh Jamal slipped to third position with 25 points from 12 matches and allowed holders Abahani to sit on top with 27 points from same number of matches. Sheikh Russel KC meanwhile leapfrogged to the second position with 25 points from 11 matches and forced Muktijoddha Sangsad to sixth

position with 15 points from 12 matches. At the BNS, both Abahani and Sheikh

Jamal started the match cautiously and in

the first 15 minutes, the ball remained firmly in the midfield before Abahani

launched the first attack. Shrugging off their disappointing 1-1 draw against Brothers Union in the previous match, Abahani looked like their usual self and dominated the last 30 minutes of the first half with three attacks inside four minutes, one of which snatched the decider. Capitalising on a through-pass from Awudu Ibrahim, Rony took an angular from shot inside the danger zone, that ended up at the back of the Sheikh Jamal net after getting the palms of goalkeeper Sultan Ahmed Shakil.

The next minute, midfielder Awudu Ibrahim, being set up by a well-judged cross from Pranotosh Kumar Das, miscued a shot that went straight into the hands of Shakil while right-back Atiqur Rahman Meshu saw his curling effort narrowly miss the target in the 23rd

minute. On 39 minutes, left-back Wali Faisal took a free-kick from 30 yards out that fell to an unmarked Rony, but the scorer headed the ball wide this time, to keep the scoreline 1-0.
