Nation joins Shahbagh youths to mourn all deaths at the hands of Jamaat-Shibir; grand rally at 3pm today

It takes just one ray of light to dispel darkness. But yesterday, there were hundreds of thousands of them to light up the country and remember those who lost their lives to Jamaat-Shibir brutality during and after the Liberation War.

At 7:00pm, the Shahbagh intersection as elsewhere in the country turned into a sea of flickering lights as tens of thousands of protesters raised their candles towards the night sky.

Shahbagh, which has come to be known as Projonno Chattar, also observed one minute's silence, which was broken by an elegy by Shimul Yusuf.

This followed an announcement of a grand rally titled

Jamaat, Shibir attack cops

31 injured in Rajshahi

At least 31 people including five policemen were injured yesterday in a clash between Jamaat-Shibir activists and police in Katakhali of Rajshahi city yesterday.

Law enforcers rounded up 273 Jamaat-Shibir men across the country including 238 in the capital on charges of vandalising vehicles, assaulting policemen, blasting handmade bombs and attacking a bus of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology.

In Rajshahi, about 500 cadres of Jamaat-e-Islami and its student wing Islami Chhatra Shibir under the cover of Olama Pir Mashayekhs blocked the

Zafar Ali Munshi, 47, a lift operator at the bank's head office in the capital, died around 11:10am at Green Life Hospital.

Stop violence against women

Thousands join human chains in Dhaka as part of global movement

Thousands of people across the country took to the streets yesterday with the commitment to put an end to violence against women.

With loud chants of "silence about violence...no more, no more!" and "fear and oppression...no more, no more!", people from all walks of life formed

human chains in over 34 locations in the capital.

More than 384 supporting organisations, representing diverse stakeholders, organised the demonstrations under a common platform, One Billion Rising (OBR), a global movement to end violence against women.

At least 5,000 people joined the

BNP discards Jamaat in Feb 17 rally
