Rain defers semifinal

Sylhet, Chittagong play today

Incessant rainfall in the city compelled the Bangladesh Premier League's (BPL) governing council to postpone the second semifinal match between the Chittagong Kings and the Sylhet Royals yesterday. The game will take place at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur

today and is scheduled to begin at 6:00 pm. It was also informed that the spectators who had bought tickets for yesterday's game would be able to enter the ground with the same tickets today.

"We waited till 8 pm for the start of the game. Our match referee and umpires repeatedly visited the ground. We decided, after talking to the franchises, that since there is a rest day tomorrow (Monday), it will be used as a reserve day," said IH Mallick, member-secretary of the BPL governing council in a press conference after the decision was taken to postpone the game.

"If rain interrupts the match on Monday as well, then we will try to play at least a five-over-a-side game. If that's not possible then we will try to play an eliminator (oneover-a side). If there's no play possible on Monday then the teams' fate will be decided upon a coin toss," he added.

A reserve day has also been added for the final match of the competition. "If the game on the 19th can't be started due to the rain, we will complete it on the 20th," said Afzalur Rahman Sinha, chairman of the BPL SEE PAGE 17 COL 2

Awudu denies Sk Russel

Abahani's veteran Ghanaian forward Awudu Ibrahim struck deep into injury time to

give his side a precious 1-1 draw against Sheikh Russel KC yesterday which maintained their two-point lead in the Grameenphone Bangladesh Premier League.

On a rain-soaked Bangabandhu National Stadium pitch, Mithun Chowdhury had given Sheikh Russel the lead in the 12th minute with a clever tap-in, and for most part of the match, the goal looked like it would be enough to earn them all three points.

However, Ibrahim had other ideas as he conjured up an angular back-heel in the fifth minute of injury time to keep the defending champions on course for a fifth professional league title.

With 28 points from 13 outings, Abahani have three more hurdles remaining - in the form of Muktijoddha Sangsad, Mohammedan

and Team BJMC.

Sheikh Russel, who have 26 points from 12 matches, have comparatively easier fixtures, against Brothers Union, Feni Soccer Club and Arambagh KS as well as title-contenders Sheikh Jamal DC. The draw also kept Sheikh Jamal firmly in the hunt as they have 25 points from 12 matches.

The draw left Sheikh Russel coach Maruful Haque bitterly disappointed, but his frustration was aimed more at the match-officials rather than his own players.


"It was bad luck for us, one which was made by the referees. The six minutes of added time was just not realistic," said Maruful at the postmatch press conference. "Now we have little chance of winning the title as I believe there is a big game being played on behind the scene, but we will fight against all that on and off the field."

Sheikh Russel had strengthened their backline by fielding two foreign defenders for the first time and they adopted a counterattacking approach which paid off as they took the lead in the twelfth minute. Mamunul Islam had played a long-ball on the right side to winger Zahid Hossain, who raced past Abahan defender Wali Faisal before laying a squarepass for an unmarked Mithun, who chose the right side of Abahani goalie Shahidul Alam Shohel to find the net.

Abahani seemed lacking in purpose with sporadic attacks and miss-passes that hardly troubled Sheikh Russel defenders. However, the Sky Blues found an opening in the 26th minute when Abdul Baten Komol delivered a cross for Awudu, whose side-volley floated over the crosspiece. In the 51st minute, Sheikh Russel's Haitian

forward Sony Norde advanced into the Abahani box availing a fumble from defender Wali Faisal but goalkeeper Shohel intervened timely to deny Sony on that occasion.

Abahani's best chance to equalise came in the 67th minute when Wali Faisal whipped in a SEE PAGE 17 COL 8

Bangladesh meet Ireland today

Bangladesh's bid for the Hockey World Cup qualification kicks off today as they face mighty Ireland in one of three matches of the World Hockey League (Round-2) on the opening day at the Major Dhyan Chan Hockey Stadium in New Delhi, India.

Bangladesh are the fourth-strongest side in the group on paper, after India, Ireland and China and are just ahead of lowly Fiji in the six-team group from which the top two teams will qualify for the semifinal round.

Bangladesh, ranked 40th in the world, will be the underdogs against Ireland, who are rankled 15th, and even a draw against the European side will be considered an excellent result before they take on other favourites China and India.

Bangladesh had qualified for Round-2 by becoming undefeated champions in Round-1 in September, 2012 where they beat Singapore, Thailand and Hong Kong. Buoyed by that success, and two months of preparation, Bangladesh set their sights on an upset, either against Ireland or China, before they left for India five days ago. Apart from the big three -- India, Ireland and China --Bangladesh will be the favourites against Fiji who are

Serena at her best

Serena Williams celebrated her recapture of the world number one ranking with her best performance of the year in a 6-3, 6-2 trouncing of Maria Sharapova to reach the Qatar Open final on Saturday.

Spectacularly heavy hitting carried the 15-time Grand Slam title-winner into Sunday's final against top seed and defending champion Victoria Azarenka.

Saturday's defeat for French Open champion Sharapova was the Russian's first in Doha where she had won the title in both her previous appearances.

Williams showed few signs of the back and ankle injuries or of the cold which had been
