
#### CARETAKER DEMAND BNP to set up nationwide 'Gonotantra Mancha'

# Dhaka-Ctg six-lane expressway on cards

Communications ministry finalises proposal

The communications ministry has proposed to build a six-lane Dhaka-Chittagong Expressway under publicprivate partnership (PPP) initiative.

The proposal for the expressway, to be operated on a build, own, operate and transfer (Boot) model, will be placed at a meeting of the cabinet committee on economic affairs tomorrow.

According to the proposal, if the expressway is built on an elevated level its cost will be \$6.1 billion, and if it is constructed at ground level, the cost will be \$2.2 billion.

After completing the construction

work of the expressway, it will be operated exclusively on the basis of toll collection.

The government has already started preparing a detail design of the expressway with financial assistance from the Asian Development Bank (ADB).

## Blasts kill 83 in Syria

A spate of bombings across Damascus killed at least 83 people in the deadliest day for the capital since Syria's war erupted, a watchdog said yesterday.

Thursday's biggest bombing, which both the regime and its opponents blamed on "terrorists", killed 61 people and left a trail of destruction in the city centre, said the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights.

The attack, in Mazraa district, was carried out by a suicide bomber who detonated his explosives-laden car near the entrance of the Baath party's main offices,

said the Britain-based monitor.

The blast wounded more than 200 people in a wide radius, including Nayef Hawatmeh, the head of the Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine, which said he was hit by flying glass in his office 500 metres away.

Russian news agencies reported the windows of Moscow's embassy were blown out, although no staff were hurt.

Meanwhile, Russia yesterday accused the United States of applying double standards over Syria and blamed Washington for blocking a UN Security Council statement condemning the blast.



### Jamaat ban now matter of time

State minister tells BBC Sanglap

State Minister for Law Qamrul Islam yesterday said banning the politics of Jamaat-e Islami was merely a matter of time and the government would take necessary steps in appropriate time.

The government must fulfil the six-point demands made by the Shahbagh protesters, he said, adding that if there was any war criminal in the government, he would be put on trial as well.

Qamrul Islam was speaking at the 15th episode of the BBC Bangladesh Sanglap at the BIAM Auditorium.

The Shahbagh protesters on Thursday placed the six-point demands including issuing an ultimatum to the government to bring war crimes charges against Jamaat and initiate legal process by March 26 to ban the party.
