

Zahed powers Ctg Abahani

Proteas' clean sweep

Cricket

South Africa completed a series clean sweep when they beat Pakistan by an innings and 18 runs on the third day of the third and final Test against South Africa at SuperSport Park on Sunday.

Pakistan were bowled out for 235 in their second innings, an improvement on their first innings total of 156. But the margin of victory and the series result was a fair reflection of the dominance of South Africa, the world champions, playing in their home conditions.

Dale Steyn took four for 80 and was responsible for the run-out of Azhar Ali which sparked a collapse of the Pakistan middle-order.

For the only time in the series, the Pakistan lower-order showed some resistance and Steyn was frustrated in a final spell of eight overs after tea as the last pair, Rahat Ali and

Mohammad Irfan, played and missed or edged the ball out of reach of the fielders.

At the other end Kyle Abbott was unable to complete a ten-wicket haul on his Test debut, finishing with two for 39 after taking seven for 29 in the first innings.

Finally, captain Graeme Smith turned to left-arm spinner Robin Peterson who trapped Rahat leg before wicket with his sixth ball.

South Africa won the first Test in Johannesburg by 211 runs and the second in Cape Town by four wickets. None of the matches went to a fifth day.

An early finish seemed in prospect when Pakistan lost four wickets quickly after lunch to be floundering at 114 for six, but Sarfraz Ahmed (40) and Saeed Ajmal (31) batted enterprisingly and with a modicum of luck to put on 69 for the seventh wicket. Azhar and Imran Farhat defied the South African bowlers for most of a morning during which only the wicket of Younis Khan fell.

They saw Pakistan through to lunch at 87 for two, with Azhar on 27, eked out over 110 balls.

in 2010 and 2011 respectively. Anamul Haque Bijoy, who was a stand-in for Tamim Iqbal in Bangladesh's last Test against the West Indies in November, has been retained.

Speaking to reporters at Mirpur yesterday, chief selector Akram Khan said that they had discussed a number of names for Shakib's replacement. "He is our top bowler and batsman. After a long discussion we decided to take Enamul and Mominul," said Akram.

"Enamul's place was contested by Saqlain Sajib and Mosharraf Hossain, but at the end we went with Enamul as he has a lot more experience," he added.

Explaining the decision to include Mominul, Akram said, "We were in a bit of a tussle between Mominul and Marshall Ayub since both have performed very well in recent times. But then we thought that since we have three to four right-handed batsmen in the middle order, the left-handed Mominul would be a better choice. He would also be a better choice to counter the left-arm spin of Rangana Herath," said Akram, adding that Marshall, who had scored two double centuries in the last domestic season, was unlucky not to have made the squad this time.

Meanwhile, Akram indicated that Anamul is most likely to make his debut in Sri Lanka next month as Jahurul Islam, the only other opener in the team, has been selected as a stand-by. "As of now, Tamim, Bijoy and (Shahriar) Nafees are our top 3, and Jahurul is our stand by. Things will be confirmed after our practice match in Sri Lanka," the chief selector added.

Like the last Test squad picked for the West Indies Tests, the selectors have included two specialist spinners -- Shohag Gazi and Enamul -- in the squad. Unlike the last selection, Robiul's inclusion means that there are four pacers -- Shahadat Hossain, Abul Hasan and Rubel Hossain being the other three. "We are worried about our pace bowling performance. Our top pacers did not play in the Bangladesh Cricket League (BCL) and it's not possible to judge them based on the Bangladesh Premier League T20. We had to mostly depend on our coach's opinion."

With regard to Robiul's recall, Akram said: "Robiul has played well in the BCL and has done alright in National Cricket League. He did not get a team in the BPL. So he was in the academy for a month and according to the coach he has been improving day by day."

AFC CHALLENGE CUP QUALIFIERS

Booters fly to Nepal today

The Bangladesh national football team leave here today for Nepal to take part in the AFC Challenge Cup Qualifiers without a clear goal but Dutch coach Lodewijk de Kruif believes Bangladesh can at least, show a great deal of fight, if no qualify.

"I've had four training sessions and had a good impression of the players. I shared my ideas with them, what I want from them and what they want. There was determination and willingness among the players and they are willing to fight. We will fight in Nepal for what we want and what the people want," said Kruif at a press conference at the BFF House yesterday.

"From my background, I educated the players. I have an educated team and back-up. When you get a back-up, you will get results. You won't get results without doing nothing," said the Dutch coach.

The 43-year old coach will have to bank on a depleted squad to deliver the goods as experienced striker Zahid Hasan Emily, winger Zahid Hossain, defender Rezaul Karim and goalkeeper Mustaqur Rahman have been kept out of the 23-member final squad due to injuries. Striker Toklish Ahmed and midfielder Jamal Hossain have been included for the first time.

"Yes, we will miss a few players, who are the top players of the league but we can't do anything about injuries. I think all my 23 players are good and we got a few youngsters who are eager to show their worth at the top level. Let's see what they do."

Describing about the positives the coach had found during the training sessions, De Kruif said, "It is important to know where your nose is, we have to put our noses at the right direction. I have

found my players walking and crawling all over to fight it out. They were not taking any rest and everybody is willing to fight so overall impression is very positive."

Kruif rated Palestine the favourites in the group followed by hosts Nepal and said he had no idea about Northern Mariana Island.

"From the information, video footage and data I have, Palestine are the favourites in the pool. They recently beat India 4-2 and I think they have a good player who scored three times in that match. Nepal at home are also a difficult opponent. Nobody knows anything about Northern Mariana Island and my opinion is not to underestimate any opponent."

Captain Mohammad Sujan believes that they would be able to produce some good results as all the players were in action in the professional football league.

Assistant coach Rene Koster informed that the fitness level of players was pretty good as he tried a new workout for the players.

ablaze with his amazing strokeplay as he smashed 22 boundaries and five sixes during his 243-ball assault much to the delight of a sizeable Sunday crowd which cheered the Indians as they went about consolidating their position in the match.

Dhoni, who was agonisingly run out for 99 against England in India last Test in Nagpur, changed the complexion of the game with his aggressive batting after the hosts lost Sachin Tendulkar (81) early in the morning session. Tendulkar, who gave glimpses of his vintage form Saturday, could add just 10 runs to his tally.

The Indians found the going a little tough in the pre-lunch session as the runs dried up but the second new ball saw the game

slipping away from the Australians as both Dhoni and Kohli attacked the bowlers with an array of shots on both sides of the wicket.

The duo added 128 runs for the fifth wicket before off-spinner Nathan Lyon provided the breakthrough for the visitors with India still 56 runs short of Australia's first innings total.

Kohli paid the price for a lapse in concentration as he tried to lift a delivery from Lyon over mid-on but could not get the desired elevation and Mitchell Starc latched on to a good catch. Kohli clobbered 15 boundaries and a six during his 206-ball knock.

Dhoni then took centre-stage and virtually single-handedly took India to a position of strength with a superb batting display in

hot and humid conditions.
