# Migration cost only Tk 20,000

Bangladeshi workers will soon be able to migrate to Bahrain under state arrangements and by spending only around Tk 20,000, Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Minister Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain said yesterday.

for the workers' return tickets, the migration cost will come down drastically," he told reporters at his office after a discussion with a three-member delegation from Bahrain. Presently, a Bangladeshi worker spends Tk 2 to 3 lakh to go to Bahrain because of the involvement of middlemen.

"So, to reduce the cost, we have decided to send workers under government-to-government (G-to-G) system," Mosharraf continued, "If the workers go to Bahrain through this process, we will be able to keep track and ensure their overall safety."

The minister said the government would allow the private sector to send workers abroad when the situation in the manpower sector regained normalcy and the malpractices reduced.

Both the countries have agreed to follow the G-to-G process for recruitment of Bangladeshi workers in a regular basis. However, there was no information about **SEE PAGE 19 COL 8**

Prosecutor Sahidur Rahman told the International Crimes Tribunal-1 that Mobarak was involved in mass killing, murder, abduction, torture and confinement of people in Brahmanbaria and Akhaura during the Liberation War.




