ADP efforts speed up

The implementation rate of annual development programme (ADP) rose 4 percentage points year-on-year in the first seven months of the current fiscal year.

Between July 2012 and January 2013, Tk 21,039 crore was spent by different ministries and divisions, which is 38 percent of the year's allocation of Tk 55,000 crore.

In the same period last fiscal year, some 34 percent of

seven months, 67.6 percent came from government funds and the remaining from foreign aid. This year, the mobilisation of foreign aid has gone up: Tk 21,500 crore of foreign aid has been allocated for ADP projects, of which 32 percent has been used up in the

July-January period. Only 24 percent of the foreign allocation was utilised in the same period last year, which prompted the government and development partners to take a number of

steps, said an official of the Economic Relations Division. "The problems in utilisation of foreign aid are discussed every three months at a meeting of the local consultative group, a platform of the local representatives of development partners," the official said.

Of the 53 ministries and divisions to which the Tk 55,000 crore was allocated, 10 got 72 percent of the sum.

The 10 ministries and divisions are: roads and power divisions, primary and mass education, local government division, education ministry, health and family welfare ministry, railway ministry, industries ministry, energy and mineral resources division and water resources ministry.

The roads and power divisions utilised the fund the most, spending 54 percent of their allocation in the first seven months of the year.

The other notable performers are: primary and mass education ministry used 51 percent, local government division 49 percent and education ministry 45 percent.

Of the poor performers, the health and family welfare ministry utilised 28 percent of its allocation, railway ministry 20 percent, industries ministry 11 percent, energy and mineral resources division 36 percent and water resources ministry 33 percent.

Grameenphone row can put off foreign investors

Roundtable spotlights setbacks to FDI

The government's inappropriate handling of the problems faced by big foreign investors may affect is very important that the existing foreign direct investment (FDI) flows, experts said yesterday.

"How the biggest investors are treated here in Bangladesh is crucial," William Hanna, European Union (EU)'s ambassador to Bangladesh said, adding he has seen

Telenor, Europe's biggest investor in Bangladesh, face problems "time and again".

"Investors talk to each other, so it investors are treated right -- to attract more funds."

Recently, a commission on Grameen Bank recommended that the licence of Grameenphone, in which Telenor has a 55.8 percent stake, be suspended.

The EU ambassador said Bangladesh has the potential, but stability, predictability of business environment, a level playing field and transparency are vital to luring in foreign investors.

Hanna's comments came at a roundtable discussion co-organised by Bangladesh Enterprise Institute (BEI) and the Asia Foundation, at the capital's Ruposhi Bangla Hotel.

Businesses worried over political unrest

Businesspeople yesterday expressed concern about the ongoing political unrest and frequent shutdowns, which they said are a major obstacle to trade and both domestic and foreign investment.

Almost all business are being affected when the

economy is taking off, said Kazi Akram Uddin Ahmed, president of the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry, the apex trade body. Ahmed said this when he was leading a delegation

at a meeting with Commerce Minister GM Quader at the latter's secretariat in Dhaka. "It will not be right to look for export markets only.

We should also take care of the domestic market. The political unrest will not let the domestic economy expand," Ahmed said.

If necessary, heads of the two major political parties should sit together to resolve the political crisis, he added. The bank interest rate on lending must not cross 15-

16 percent for the sake of the businesses, as some banks charge higher rates, he said. He demanded an allocation of Tk 40 crore for the construction of the FBCCI office building from the

upcoming national budget for fiscal 2013-14. The size of the next national budget might be Tk 2.30 lakh crore, Ahmed said. Quader said the commerce ministry will try to

amend the trade organisation rules by May to introduce a 'direct election system' in different trade bodies and expand the tenure of elected committees to three years. "I will hold two seminars -- one in Dhaka and one in

Kolkata -- within March 15 to resolve problems in trade through land ports, particularly of Hilly, Sonamasjid and Bhomra land ports," Quader said.

He said he has already talked with some Indian ministers and Bangladeshi high commissioner in New Delhi.

Race is on, no time to lose

Analysts at a US conference say Bangladesh must bring political stability soon

Investors may bypass Bangladesh for other less attractive locations unless the country is able to achieve political stability soon, speakers said at an international conference held in the US recently.

All the participants agreed that the political gridlock Bangladesh has faced is a huge barrier and must be overcome. There is not much time to lose since the race is on, they said.

Policy makers, businesses, civil society and NGO community should work together to redouble their efforts to attain much higher growth with equity, they said.

The conference on Bangladesh was

organised by Bangladesh Development Initiative (BDI), a US based think tank and advocacy group of Bangladeshi professionals in the US, at the University of California Berkeley campus on February 22-24.

The Center for South Asia Studies (CSAS), a leading research organisation on South Asia studies, co-hosted the conference, according to a statement.

The overall theme of the conference was "bridging the policy-action divide in Bangladesh: challenges and prospects for Bangladesh's future."

Around 20 academic sessions with 50 papers were organised covering a broad spectrum of challenges faced by Bangladesh economy and society.

Inditex to clear bills for Smart garments but won't sell products

Spanish retail giant Inditex has decided to receive the products that the fireravaged Smart Export Garments of Bangladesh was making for the retailer without its knowledge.

But the retailer will not put the garments on display as the factory was a noncompliant one, an official of Inditex said.

After buying the products from Smart Export, the Dhaka-based factory January 26, the retailer will destroy the are still monitoring the situation. products, he said.

Logos of Bershka and Lefties -- two major brands of Inditex -- were found in the ashes after the fire.

"We will buy all the garments from the factory, but will not put those on display at our stores," said the official at the Dhaka office of Inditex, asking not to be named.

However, the official did not say anything about the value of the gar-

ments or how those will be destroyed. Earlier there were reports that

outsourcing company Wonnover and Bangladeshi supplier Centex, who subcontracted Smart Export.

Wonnover executes the work orders of the retail giant through various garment factories like Centex in Bangladesh.

After the fire at Smart Export, Inditex found that Centex shifted orders of 3,000 pieces of jackets to the unlicensed Bangladeshi factory under an alleged subcontract arranged by Wonnover.





