
A special salute to Barcelona

Cox's Bazar stadium gets land

The Bangladesh Cricket Board's (BCB) dream of building an exclusive cricket stadium in the tourism city of Cox's Baza is set to come true as board high-ups were given assurance regarding the land for the structure during a meeting with Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday.

The BCB officials, led by its president Nazmul Hassan Papon, met with the Prime Minister at her office to discuss next year's ICC Twenty20 World Cup to be held in Bangladesh.

BCB's ad-hoc committee member Dr. Mallick, who accompanied the team along with Ahmed Sajjadul Alam, Mahbubul Anam and AJM Nasir, informed that they had a very fruitful meeting with the Prime Minister. "Our president

Confident Tigers reach Colombo

The Bangladesh cricket team reached Colombo yesterday with hopes of turning the tide of a woeful record in Sri Lanka during the month-long trip.

Mushfigur Rahim's men travel to Matara today where they will play the tour-opening three-day game against the Indies. That is something we are looking Sri Lanka Development Emerging Team starting from March 3. The Tigers will then play two Tests, three ODIs and a T20I against former world champions Sri Lanka.

Bangladesh have a woeful record in the island as they have lost all eight Tests played there since 2001, but captain Mushfiqur Rahim expressed his optimism, taking into account the current strength of the Sri Lanka team.

Even the loss of star all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan due to injury and the lastmoment injury casualties of Naeem Islam, Shahriar Nafees and Enamul Haque could not dent the confidence of the Bangladesh team. They were instead looking forward to cash in on their recent good showing against West Indies at home in November-December last year.

Mushfiqur said during the first official

press conference in Colombo yesterday that they were looking forward to the three-day practice game before the twomatch Test series.

"They [Sri Lanka] are a formidable team especially at home, but it is not impossible to do well against them. Our first priority is the Test series. We got ourselves into decent positions but failed to finish the job in the Tests against the West to improve upon here. We have a threeday practice game before the first Test and a few training sessions. We have to make the best use of that and then see how it goes," said Mushfigur.

"There's no secret really. Everyone has worked hard and everyone has contributed. Players have understood their roles and have delivered, even the newest member. The team spirit has been excellent," he added when asked about the secret behind Bangladesh's improved showing over the last couple of years.

Like the skipper, Bangladesh coach Shane Jurgensen said that they have a good chance this time to improve their record in Sri Lanka.

SIDDIKUR eyes history

Siddikur is on track of making history when he shared the opening round lead Open Championship International Final Qualifying-Asia on Thursday.

The Bangladeshi got off to a hot start where he was five-under after six holes to maintain his bid to become the first player to represent his country in the Open Championship.

China's Hu Mu, Australian Scott Barr and Singaporeans Quincy Quek and Lam Zhiqun were a further shot back in the two-day qualifier where the top-four players qualify for the year's third Major at Muirfield in July.

Siddikur, who is the first Bangladeshi to play and win on the Asian Tour, was in a similar position in the 2011 IFQ-Asia but


he was disqualified on the last day when he failed to write a score for the last hole. He insists he will not repeat the same mistake again.

"There are no excuses for me (two years ago). I just didn't play well after shooting a with Japanese amateur Hideki 66 on the first day. I was so excited but Matsuyama on six-under-par 66 at the unfortunately I couldn't keep up. My score would have been three-over if I wasn't disqualified," said Siddikur.

With a hot putter in tow, Siddikur traded seven birdies and one bogey to lead the way with the talented Matsuyama, who is a two-time Asia-Pacific Amateur Championship winner and the first Japanese amateur to play in the 2011 Masters Tournament.

"I'm very confident and my game is good. If I can play my game, I'm quite confident I'll be able to qualify for the Open Championship," said Siddikur.



Kumar Sangakkara has been named in the squad for the Emerging XI that will play a three-day warm up match in Matara against Bangladesh while off-spinner Akila Dananjaya misses out due to injury.

"I've started batting in the nets this week and have had a good week of practice, so the match against Bangladesh is a good opportunity to get some match practice," Sangakkara said. "As long as I pull through ok, I will play in the Galle Test." Sangakkara has not played competitive cricket since

fracturing his index finger during the Boxing Day Test. He is the only player above 23 in the side captained by middle-order batsman Angelo Perera. Off-spinner Dananjaya had been named in the pre-

liminary squad for the match, but has been left out after straining his finger while taking a return catch in the latest round of first-class cricket. He will be rested for one to two weeks, but is likely to be available for the limitedovers leg of the Bangladesh tour. All-rounder Ramith Rambukwella takes his place in the Emerging XI squad.
