JAMAAT PROPAGANDA Net instigation in full force

Jamaat-Shibir activists on their Facebook page *Basher Kella* have urged their comrades to stand behind the BNP to make its today's hartal a success.

A post on the page hails the main opposition party, saying: "The government will see a new situation in the March 5 hartal. All activists will become leaders. If senior leaders are arrested, the junior leaders will give leadership. The grassroots leaders had saved the BNP after the 1/11 changeover, and they will make this movement a success."

The moderator of this page yesterday in a post termed "yellow" all the pro-liberation media. Interestingly, The Daily Star website was hacked in the evening by unknown hackers who replaced all news headlines and texts with a message: we hate yellow journalism.

In another post, the Jamaat-Shibir activists asked their IT experts to set up secret radio stations as an alternative media to air their activities against the government and to instigate religious sentiments of the people as the mainstream media are not broadcasting their views.

Eight Shibir activists were arrested in Chittagong city yesterday afternoon allegedly for planning to kill 10 teachers of a madrasa in the city.

The arrestees confessed to the police that they planned to "beat" the teachers for speaking ill of convicted war criminal Delawar Hossain Sayedee and "preaching wrong information about Islam". The Shibir activists made a list of the teachers

Govt gives in to tobacco industry *2 vital provisions dropped from anti-tobacco bill's final draft*

Two provisions crucial in controlling tobacco use have been dropped from the final draft of an anti-tobacco law following hectic lobbying from tobacco companies.

The initial draft contained the provisions for not providing farmers with soft loan or subsidy for tobacco cultivation, and not keeping smoking zone in smoke-free public places, said sources in the ministries concerned.

The Smoking and Tobacco Products Usage (Control) (Amendment) Bill, 2012 was sent to the parliamentary standing committee on health ministry yesterday for further scrutiny after it was placed in parliament for passage.

DETAINED SHIP IN INDIA Stranded crew return today

The 19 Bangladeshi crew of a ship that has been detained for last five months at Visakhapatnam seaport in India are coming home today.

Habibur Rahman, captain of the detained Bangladeshi-owned ship, MV Fatahpur Rahman, yesterday told The Daily Star over the phone that Indian immigration personnel had assured the crew of disembarking them from the ship at night.

"We will be taken to Kolkata from where we will fly to Dhaka tomorrow [today]," said Habibur, adding that relievers to man the vessel had reached the port.

Quoting a local agent of the ship, the captain said the

GHULAM AZAM'S TRIAL

Govt wraps up final arguments

Wrapping up the closing arguments in the case, the prosecution yesterday said Ghulam Azam facilitated crimes against humanity committed during the Liberation War and therefore deserves the highest punishment.

Yesterday, Chief Prosecutor Ghulam Arief Tipoo told International Crimes Tribunal-1 that Ghulam Azam was not only the mastermind but also facilitator of the crimes committed during the Liberation War in 1971.

He said due to the gravity of crimes, the war crimes case against him deserves special attention.

Earlier, prosecutor Zead Al Malum claimed before the tribunal that they had successfully proved all charges brought against him.

Prosecution completed placing argument in 10 working days.

Yesterday, Malum placed argument on law points. The prosecutor said he would submit a list of evidence so that
