The highway remained closed since Thursday as Jamaat-Shibir activists put barricades at Satkania and Lohagara upazilas of Chittagong and Chakaria upazila of Cox's Bazar hours after Jamaat leader Delawar Hossain Sayedee was sentenced to death and thousands of tourists got stuck in Cox's Bazar because of it.

Hasina, Pranab open locomotives from India

Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and visiting Indian President Pranab Mukherjee yesterday morning jointly inaugurated the commissioning of broad gauge (BG) locomotives and tank wagons of Bangladesh Railway (BR), which are being supplied under the Indian Line of Credit.

They flagged off a locomotive with 20 tank wagons and one brake van from Cantonment Station in the capital.

BR Director General Mohammad Abu Taher briefed reporters at the function about the various development activities of the BR that have been taken under the Indian LC.

He said eleven railway projects have already been undertaken at a cost of

US\$630 million out of the US\$736 million allocated for 14 projects under the one billion dollar Indian LC.

Following the decision of the joint communiqué signed on January 10, 2010 between Bangladesh and India during Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's visit to New Delhi, Indian Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh announced the one billion dollar Indian LC for Bangladesh that included railway infrastructure and procurement of broad gauge and meter gauge rolling stock.

The loan agreement was signed on August 7, 2010 between Bangladesh government and EXIM Bank of India in the presence of the then Indian finance minister and currently the president, Pranab Mukherjee.

Computers given to ashram by Pranab

Indian President Pranab Mukherjee yesterday gave computers, rare photographs and made several announcements during his visits to Narail, Kumudini in Tangail and Shilaidaha Kuthibari in Kushtia.

In Narail, he gave six computers to Ramkrishna Ashram and announced construction of a 12-room school building or a girl's hostel, said a press release.

At Kumudini, Pranab laid the foundation stone of a sophisticated sewerage collection, treatment and disposal system for Kumudini Welfare Trust. It would be built with assistance from India.

He announced participation of students of Kumudini Colleges in the 100-member Bangladesh youth delegation to visit India in 2013.

At Shilaidaha, he announced construction of Rabindra Academy, on Kuthibari premises, comprising an auditorium, a library and research facilities.

He also presented a photograph of Jorasanko, residence of Rabindranath Tagore, and copies of 20 photographs of Tagore at Visva-Bharati University Museum.

Islamists demand ban on Jamaat-Shibir

Several hundred Islamist activists in Chittagong city yesterday demanded immediate trial of Jammat-e-Islami and pro-Jamaat student body Islami Chhatra Shibir and a ban on them for their alleged involvement in hatching a plan to kill 10 Islamic scholars.

The demands were made at a protest rally jointly organised by Islamic Front Bangladesh and Islami Chhatra Sena at Wasa Intersection in Chittagong city.

On Monday, Panchlaish police arrested eight Shibir activists for their alleged involvement in hatching the plan to kill the scholars in Chittagong. They also recovered a list of names of the scholars from their possessions.

Jamaat is not an Islamic organisation as it was involved in murder, arson and rape during the Liberation War in 1971 and now it is plotting to defame Islam by planning to kill Islamic scholars.

"Islam is a religion of peace, humanity and love", said Moulana Anwarul Islam Khan.

Jamaat and its wings are involved in introducing the religion as a religion of terror and riot to the world.

Moulana Jasimuddin Taiyabi urged all to come forward to resist the plots and activities against Islam.

With Kawzi Jasimuddin in the chair, Islami Front's South District unit Secretary Mohammad Nur Alam Tareque and its Chittagong city unit Organising Secretary M Mohiuddin also spoke.

Road crashes kill 5

Five people were killed and another was injured in separate road accidents in Mymensingh and Thakurgaon yesterday.

Our Mymensingh correspondent reports, four persons were killed and another was injured as a bus hit a private car on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway in Seed Store area of Bhaluka upazila yesterday morning.

The deceased were Jasim Uddin, 40, the car driver; Bachchu Miah, 45, of Mahmudpur village in Bhaluka; Belal Uddin, 35, of Bheramara in Kushtia; and Nazrul Islam, 36, of Kaliakanda in Jamalpur.

Police said the accident took place when the Mymensingh-bound car was rammed by the oncoming passenger bus around 9:30am.

Injured Shahabuddin, 30, was rushed to Bhaluka Upazila Health Complex and, later, referred to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital.

Our Thakurgaon correspondent reports, a teenage indigenous boy died as a microbus hit him from behind while he was returning home riding a bicycle on Pirganj-Bochaganj road at Bashgara village in Pirganj upazila early yesterday.

The victim was Niluz Hemrom, 18, son of Lala Hemrom of Paria village in the upazila.

He succumbed to his injuries at Pirganj Upazila Health Complex on arrival.
