
Wright-Phillips out for season

QPR's hopes of avoiding relegation from the Premier League suffered a blow on Friday when former England winger Shaun Wright-Phillips was ruled out for the rest of the season.

Wright-Phillips, 31, had surgery on his right ankle earlier this week and QPR manager Harry Redknapp revealed the ex-Chelsea and Manchester City star will not be back in action until next season. It is a significant setback for Redknapp, whose side are seven points from safety with just seven matches remaining and face a crucial clash against fellow strugglers Wigan on Sunday.



Shakib, Tamim return

15-man squad named for Zimbabwe Tests

Ace all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan has been recalled in the 15-member Test side for the tour of Zimbabwe. However, the left-hander, who is recovering from an injury on his right shin, can play only as a batsman in the first Test.

Apart from Shakib, slow-left armer Enamul Haque Jr and top order batsman Shahriar Nafees, both of whom missed the tour of Sri Lanka due to injuries, have been recalled as well. Also selected in the side is left-arm pacer Sajidul Islam, who last played a Test match for Bangladesh in 2008. Experienced Bangladesh paceman Mashrafe Bin Mortaza, as earlier speculated, has not been included in the 15-man squad as he is yet to recover from a heel injury.

"We received Shakib's fitness report on Thursday and based on that it was decided that Shakib can play the first Test only as a batsman. His chances of bowling in the first Test are fifty-fifty, however we expect him to bowl from the second Test onwards," informed Bangladesh Cricket Board's (BCB) chief selector Akram Khan.

While it is still unsure whether Tamim Iqbal, recovering from a thumb fracture, will play the first Test, the team management is confident that the player will recover in time for the second. The other openers in the team include Jahurul Islam and Nafees. Mominul Haque's good performance in the last series has led

to him being retained. He will however have to fight to get his place in the playing eleven. With Shakib and Tamim back in the side, there are a

number of possible combinations that the team management can afford to go with.

As far as batting goes, the team selected yesterday bears a solid look as the Tigers will travel to Zimbabwe with a full-strength batting line-up. The bowling however is a different story. The recent tour of Sri Lanka saw the team struggling with a barely-fit and inexperienced pace line-up. The situation is not likely to improve significantly when the Tigers take the field for the first Test against Zimbabwe on April 17.

With pacer Abul Hasan injured and Mashrafe deemed unfit to play Test cricket, the selectors picked Sajidul to provide an extra option. "There remains a weakness in our pace bowling department. Sajidul had a good run in the Bangladesh Cricket League and also played a few good matches in the Bangladesh Premier League. He also trained under the academy here the last month. So we are trying out a different bowler," said Akram.

The other pacers in the side are Rubel Hossain, Robiul Islam and Shahadat Hossain. While Rubel and Robiul are more likely to make it through to the playing eleven, Shahadat will have to contest with Sajidul.

"Shahadat is doing okay in Tests. Not too bad but not that good either. If I had a better option then I would have taken someone else. But its time for him to show some improvement,' said Akram. Spinners Shohag Gazi and Enamul complete the bowling

Bangladesh to play India, Pakistan in England

Bangladesh will play two FIFA friendly matches against neighbouring India and Pakistan in England in June, informed Bangladesh Football Federation president Kazi Salahuddin yesterday.

India-based sports management company, Celebrity Management Group, is going to organise the friendlies among Bangladesh, India and Pakistan and they invited all of three national federations to play the friendlies in England.

"An India-based company, which organised the FIFA friendly between Argentina and Nigeria in Bangladesh, invited us to participate in the friendlies in England," said Salahuddin over the phone from India yesterday.

The BFF boss informed that Bangladesh are supposed to play against India and Pakistan on June 1 and 7.

Bangladesh Football Federation had given their nod to play the friendlies after the Celebrity Management Group invited Bangladesh to play in England as they would provide transport, food and accommodation.



The very fact that Bangladesh's team management have included a pacer who has not been in the national setup for the last five years in itself describes the sorry state the Tigers' pace department is in.

The series of injuries, coupled with some ordinary bowling, have compelled the selectors to try something different and bring in left-arm pacer Sajidul Islam. Sajidul last played for Bangladesh in 2008 when the Tigers toured New Zealand. The bowler picked three wickets in three innings stretched over two Tests, and has

not played an international match ever since. All three were wickets of top-order batsman, one of which was that of star batsman Stephen Fleming.

While his return to the side may have been based more on compulsion rather than his performance, Sajidul believes that the tour of Zimbabwe can sketch a new avenue for his international



Sajidul, who turned 25 last January, believed that he has matured as a cricketer in the last five years. "I am a lot more experienced now. In 2008 I could swing the ball just one way, and sometimes it went the other way by luck. But now I have more control on the ball and can swing the ball both ways. India women sweep series

The Bangladesh women's cricket team lost the third and final T20I against India by ten runs at the Reliance Stadium in Baroda yesterday. With the victory the hosts have completed a comprehensive 3-0 whitewash against the visitors.

After electing to bat first, the hosts rode on a half-century stand for the opening wicket between Mona Meshram (22) and Smriti Mandhana (39). The partnership was broken in the eighth over and the run rate deteriorated over the next five overs. A few late hits from captain Harmeet Kaur and Poonam Raut took India to 123 for nine. Panna Ghosh and Salma Khatun took two wickets each while debutant Fahima Khatun, Jahanara Alam and Shukhtara Rahman took one each.

In reply, Bangladesh began brightly and maintained the required runrate in the first half of the game. At the half-way mark they were positioned at 50 for 1, with Shukthara and Lata Mondal looking set. However, Shuktara was run out in the 11th over and that led to a collapse.
