



Attack on 3 more Hindu temples

Religious fanatics vandalised nine idols at three Hindu temples in Pakulla union under Mirzapur upazila of Tangail early yesterday.

Quoting witnesses, police said the criminals entered the Kali Mandir, Ponchayet Puja Mondir and Shib Mondir situated at Moha Shashan (crematorium) on Thursday night after breaking locks of their iron-gates.

They damaged the idols and dragged the severed parts out of the temples. In the morning, locals found the fragmented idols

strewn all over the cremato-

39 killed as building crumbles in India

69 injured, many trapped under debris

At least 39 people were killed and dozens injured after an illegal, half-constructed building collapsed in seconds "like a pack of cards" on the outskirts of India's financial centre Mumbai, officials and witnesses said.

Rescue workers using cranes and bulldozers searched for survivors in the wreck of steel and concrete yesterday after the seven-storey building crumbled on Thursday night.

Residents said labourers paying rent of around \$5 a day had lived in it.

A shortage of cheap homes in Asia's third-largest economy has led to a rise in illegal construction by developers who use substandard materials and shoddy methods in order to offer rock-bottom

rents to low-paid workers.

"The building collapsed like a pack of cards within three to four seconds," said Ramlal, a local resident. "It just tilted a bit and collapsed," he said.

The building, which was in a forested area in the city of Thane, had been made using poor materials and without proper approvals, said Sandeep Malvi, a spokesman for licensing authority the Thane Municipal Corporation.

He said 39 people had been killed and 69 injured. Indian media quoted officials giving higher death tolls.

Rescue workers pulled an infant alive from the rubble as they used jackhammers and other equipment to cut through metal and concrete in their hunt for survivors.


Afghan donkey bomb kills cop

A fund set up by Pakistani schoolgirl Malala Yousafzai, who was shot by the Taliban for campaigning for girls' education, is to send 40 girls to school in her home region with the support of US actress Angelina Jolie.

Malala, 15, announced the fund's

first project in a video message late Thursday to the Women in the World Conference in New York from Britain, where she was sent for surgery after the attack on her schoolbus last October.

She said the \$45,000 grant, raised with the help of Jolie and two women's charities, would send 40 girls aged between five and 12 to school in Pakistan's Swat Valley, where she is from.

"Announcing the first grant of the Malala Fund is the happiest moment in my life," Malala said. "Let us turn the education of 40 girls into 40 million girls."
