Aggrieved citizens yesterday strongly criticised the government's inaction to release the bloggers arrested on allegation of demeaning Islam, urging the ruling party not to sacrifice democratic and pro-liberation war values to appease "dark forces".

At a solidarity rally at Raju memorial, Dhaka University students and teachers, academics, and cultural activists also demanded that the government uphold the citizens' constitutional right to freedom of speech.

They threatened to hold tougher programmes if the bloggers are not released immediately.

"It is hurtful that though Hefajat rally made 'derogatory' remarks on the prime minister, attacked journalists, attempted to damage Gonojagoron Mancha, the home minister still thanked them by branding it as a 'peaceful' rally," said Kaberi Gayen, associate professor of Mass Communication and Journalism Department.

Cultural activist Rokeya Prachi, addressing the chief of both of the major parties, said, "With what pledge will you

seek votes from the female voters in the upcoming elections? "Will you make separate arrangements for the male and female lawmakers in the parliament if you meet the 13-point demand articulated by the Hefajat-e Islam?"

HELD BLOGGERS BEFORE MEDIA

Writ challenging legality filed

A writ petition was filed with the High Court yesterday challenging the legality of law enforcers' action in producing three detained suspected bloggers before the media last week.

The law enforcers nabbed Subrata Adhikari Shuvo, Russel Parvez and Mashiur Rahman Biplob on charge of posting "derogatory comments about Islam and Prophet Muhammad (pbuh)" on the internet and produced them before the media on April 2.

Human rights activist Sultana Kamal, four Dhaka University teachers and a Jahangirnagar University teacher filed the writ petition saying that exposing the three detained in front of the media and stating that they are responsible for the offence is illegal and a violation of their constitutional rights to fair trial.

The petitioners also prayed to the HC to direct the government to give compensations to the arrestees and

ensure their security in custody and after their release. In December last year, the HC had directed the director general of Rapid Action Battalion and commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan Police not to present any accused who is under investigation or under trial before the media, they mentioned.
