Scrapping of new provision demanded

VESTED PROPERTY RETURN ACT

Rights activists and civil society members yesterday expressed concern over a new provision in the proposal for amending the Vested Property Return Act, 2001 that was approved by the cabinet on April 1 and demanded scrapping of the provision.

According to the new provision, the land ministry will have the jurisdiction for extending the timeframe for publishing a gazette of the list of vested properties, lodging appeal for property ownership

and disposing of cases. In this regard, they said if the provision exists, the ministry will continue publishing new lists of vested properties for an indefinite period and continue to make people suffer.

There might also be the chance that other properties will be declared as vested property, they told a press conference at **Dhaka Reporters Unity** organised by nine rights

and social organisations. The organisations include Ain o Salish Kendra, BLAST, ALRD, Nijera Kori and Arpito Sampotti Ain Protirodh Andolon. Advocate Subrata Chowdhury, presidium member of Hindu Buddha Christian Oikkyo Parishad, also spoke.

## HEFAJAT'S ATTACK ON FEMALE JOURNALISTS Journos demand punishment

Journalist leaders yesterday protested the attacks on female journalists by activists of Hefajat-e Islam in a long march rally in the capital on April 6.

They demanded that the government ensure punish-

ment to the culprits, and ensure journalists' security and freedom of the press. They also urged journalists to take strong position against the religious bigots. The leaders made the remarks when addressing a rally before Jatiya Press Club in the capital. Bangladesh

Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) jointly organised the event to protest the attacks on the female journalists. On April 6, activists of the radical Islamist group

assaulted four journalists, including Ekushey Television reporter Nadia Sharmeen, and passed lewd comments to them when they were doing their duties at Hefajat's rally.

BFUJ President Iqbal Sobhan Chowdhury said although attacks on the journalists and media vehicles were common during the political parties' programmes, the attacks on the female journalists have introduced a new dimension in the country.

Any attack on the journalists and media is a bad omen for democracy, he said.

BFUJ Secretary General Abdul Jalil Bhuyian criticised Home Minister Muhiuddin Khan Alamgir for thanking Hefajat and for not taking necessary steps over the attacks on the female journalists.

DUJ President Omar Faruque said they would hold rallies before offices of the political parties, if any more journalists and media vehicles come under attack.
