# Govt to take army help

Communications ministry to sit with AFD on April 16

The communications ministry officials will sit in a meeting with the army high-ups on April 16 to discuss how it could take assistance from the Armed Forces Division to construct the Padma bridge.

"The government will seek assistance from the army for the construction of Padma bridge," Communications Minister Obaidul Quader told a function yesterday.

The function was organised at a field of the proposed Hamdard University at Gazaria in Munshiganj, marking the conclusion of repair works at Meghna-Gumti Bridge.

Quader, however, did not make it clear what kind of assistance the ministry would seek from the army during the forthcoming meeting at Setu Bhaban in the capital.

Obaidul Quader, Army Chief General Iqbal Karim Bhuiyan, Bridges Division Secretary Khandaker Anwarul Islam and officials of Special Work Organisation of the Army Engineering Corps will attend the meeting, ministry sources said.

Earlier, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina said the army would be involved in constructing the Padma bridge.

The construction of \$2.9 billion Padma bridge became uncertain as donors cancelled their funding on the grounds of allegation of corruption in the project.

The army, which received Tk 437 crore for repair works on Meghna and Meghna-Gumti bridges, has replaced 30 expansion joints and 96 hinge bearings of two bridges.

Prosecution says sniper brought from Pakistan to kill the war crimes accused, seeks security for him

: The prosecution yesterday went out of its way to seek security for war crimes · accused Abdul Alim after getting "alarm-· ing information" that he could be · attacked by snipers.

Alim, a former member of late president Ziaur Rahman's cabinet, was indicted on 17 charges of crimes against · humanity allegedly committed during the · Liberation War and he was the lone accused enjoying conditional bail due to : his poor health.

Placing the petition before the · International Crimes Tribunal-2, · Prosecutor Rana Dasgupta said · bdnews24.com and amadershomoy.com

recently posted a link in their websites, which claimed that Alim would come under attack so that the war crimes trials could be foiled.

Quoting bdnews24.com link, the prosecutor said a plot was hatched, tied to the conspiracy of the recent long march of Hefajat-e Islam, and a sniper was brought from Pakistan with Alim as target of the assassin.

"If they make it, then Jamaat would be able to say that detainees [of war crimes cases] aren't protected and the whole trial was a farce," said Rana Dasgupta quoting the link which claimed, "It was part of a Tk 85 crore deal."

# No move for negotiations with Baira

Employment minister says recruitment agencies must follow directives

The government has taken a tough stance against manpower recruiters as the overseas employment ministry is not considering negotiations with Baira to resume its operations.

"The recruitment agencies are bound to follow the instructions of the ministry. They can't oppose any decision of the government," Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Minister Khandker Mosharrat Hossain told The Daily Star yesterday.

On Sunday, Bangladesh Association of International Recruiting Agencies (Baira) suspended its activities blaming the government for losing foreign job markets.

Baira was confusing people about the government's initiatives, complained the minister. "They [Baira] don't have any legal rights to put pressure on the government as they are working as only the agents of the ministry."
