# At cost of people

It was a scorching hot day yesterday, and Mohammad Masud stood at what is typically a bustling spot in the capital's Motijheel with a heap of peanuts.

But there was hardly anyone to buy peanuts from him. "This is the usual scene on hartal days," Masud says. The sole breadwinner of a family of six who live in Kishoreganj, Masud last remitted them Tk 2,000 two

months back. "I have been receiving constant reminders to send money, but I don't have enough. The business has been terrible of late."

### Four killed in hartal

STAR REPORT

Three persons were killed and more than 100 people injured as Hefajat-e Islam and Jamaat-e-Islami activists joined in by locals clashed with Awami League men in Fatikchhari upazila of Chittagong during the countrywide dawn-to-dusk hartal yesterday.

Around 100 vehicles including motorcycles, jeeps, pick-ups, a police van and a fire truck were torched during the incident. Besides, around 20 shops were set ablaze, said police.

Meanwhile, a Jamaat activist died in Khulna in fighting between police and Shibir men. The victim was identified as Mansur Ali Gazi, 40, an activist of Jamaat-e-Islami.

Of the dead in Chittagong, two were primarily identified as Forkan and

# Khaleda seizes GDP growth to go down

Moody downgrades it from 6.3pc to 5.9 amid hartal spate

Recent political strikes in Bangladesh are weighing on its economic growth, heightening its vulnerability to event risks, and threatening to derail reform progress, a credit negative for the country, Moody's said in its issuer comment yesterday.


The global rating agency also warned that prolonged unrest is likely to undermine Bangladesh's democratic institutions and distract the government from effective
