Binod Bihari's death mourned

The acting president, the prime minister and the opposition leader yesterday mourned the death of Binod Bihari Chowdhury, a co-fighter of Surya Sen in the 1930 Chittagong armoury raid, which was part of the movement to free India from the Britishcolonial rule.

Acting President Abdul Hamid said Binod Bihari courageously fought injustice in British India, Pakistan and Bangladesh, reports UNB.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina termed him a symbol of valor and patriotism, says BSS. Binod Bihari was respected by all, UNB quotes BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia.

Condolences aslo came from individuals and sociopolitical bodies. Among them are Gonoforum President Dr Kamal Hossain, Dhaka University Vice Chancellor Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique, BNP leader Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury, Primary and Mass Education Minister Afsarul Ameen, women's leader Mushtari Safi, poet Abul Momen, and academician Rita Dutta.

Binod Bihari died in a Kolkata hospital on Wednesday at the age of 104. He will be cremated at Abhoy Mitra cremation centre in Chittagong city, reports a Chittagong correspondent. His body, to be flown in from Kolkata today, will lie in state at the capital's Central Shaheed Minar before reaching Chittagong.

Ain o Salish Kendra and Gonojagoron Mancha also mourned the death. Binod Bihari was born in Boalkhali upazila, Chittagong in 1909.

DEV COOPERATION Australia, Bangladesh sign deal

War Crimes Charges

Mobarak's indictment decision April 23

The International Crimes Tribunal-1 will decide on April 23 whether it will frame war crimes charges against Mobarak Hossain, a former Awami League leader of Brahmanbaria.

On that day, the three-member tribunal also give an order on the bail petition of Mobarak, now detained in Dhaka Central Jail. He was sued in 2009 for killing a proliberation Ansar personnel, Abdul Khaleque, in 1971.

Mobarak, a Razakar commander during the Liberation War, had been the organising secretary of a union unit AL in Akhaura for 16 years till 2012.

The prosecution brought five charges of crimes, including genocide, murder, torture, killing and abduction, against him after completing its investigation.

Mobarak's counsel Ahsanul Huq Hena claimed his client to be innocent and hoped that the tribunal would free him of the charges. Prosecutor Syed Haidar Ali, however, said they had enough witnesses and documents to prove the charges.

On Wednesday, the prosecution prayed to the tribunal for indicting Mobarak.

REDEMARCATION OF CONSTITUENCIES

Complaint disposal starts April 23

The Election Commission will begin on April 23 the disposal of 894 complaints filed against the proposed changes in the boundaries of 87 parliamentary constituencies across 28 districts.

The EC will hold hearings at its secretariat in the capital to adjudicate on the complaints, filed by ministers, and ruling Awami League and BNP lawmakers, among others.

"The hearings will be held from April 23 to May 12," Election Commissioner Shah Nawaz told reporters at the EC Secretariat yesterday.

The EC will hear the objections on Rangpur and part of Khulna division on April 23, Khulna and Barisal division on April 25, Sylhet and part of Chittagong division on April 28, Chittagong and part of Dhaka division on April 30, remaining complaints of Dhaka division on May 2, 9, and 12.

The changes in the boundaries will be finalised on disposal of the objections.

The EC on February 6 published the draft list proposing changes in the boundaries of 87 out of 300 parliamentary constituencies.

'RELEASE OF ARMS-AMMO FILLED VAN'

Police has started investigations over an allegation that six policemen of Savar Police Station had let a pickup van, carrying arms-ammunitions, go in exchange for a bribe on March 18.

Sub-Inspector (SI) Rajjab Ali alleged that his colleague, SI Emdadul Huq, and five policemen had tried to divert the issue by terming it a mugging incident.

The van, ignoring his signal to stop at a police checkpoint on Dhaka Aricha Highway around 1:30am, had stopped some distance away after being chased. When Rajjab approached the vehicle, three to four men attacked him with bricks, he said.

While he was being hospitalised, SI Emdadul and the five reached the spot and let the accused go, he said, adding that the arms-ammunitions were meant for subversive acts in the March 18 hartal in Bogra. Emdadul, however, told The Daily Star that the van,

whom they arrested with a vehicle in possession. The police station Officer-in-Charge Asaduzzaman termed Emdadul a "sincere and honest" officer and

carrying saris and lungis, was attacked by three muggers,

Rajjab "insincere and unfit". Superintendent of Police Habibur Rahman and Assistant Superintendent of Police Mashiuddowla Reza, investigating the matter from April 6, said they were yet to get any proof of the allegation.


The United States has provided training to law enforcement officials to enhance skills so that they can manage criminal violation of laws and conduct complex investigations.
