Transparency International Bangladesh yesterday demanded the government stand firm against any possibility of corruption and ensure maximum level of transparency and accountability in the Padma Bridge project.

The demand came in the wake of the government decision to construct the bridge with own financing.

In press statement, TIB Executive Director Iftekharuzzaman said, "The people breathed a sigh of relief after the finance minister's assurance that the government will announce a five-year expenditure plan for construction of the Padma Bridge, and float tender by

As the World Bank and other international development organisations had distanced themselves from the funding process, he added, the government must probe the allegation of corruption and bring the corrupt people to justice.


