

Fakhrul, Noman seek better treatment

An HC bench yesterday started hearing the petitions and fixed tomorrow for resuming the hearing.

Release of Mahmudur Rahman sought

A group of journalists has protested the arrest of Amar Desh Acting Editor Mahmudur Rahman, terming it a violation of freedom of press and expression.

They demanded immediate release of the editor.

In Dhaka, factions of Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ) and Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) joined a token hunger strike event before Jatiya Press Club from 11:00am to 2:00pm.

Ruhul Amin Gazi, president of the faction of BFUJ, said the government is trying to establish a "Baksal like rule" by closing the daily.

In Chittagong, Chittagong Metropolitan Union of Journalists also went on a four-hour token hunger strike from 10:00am in front of its office on Noor Ahmed Road.

CMUJ President Shamshul Haque Haidari and General Secretary Md Shahnewaj, and BFUJ Vice President Iskander Ali Chowdhury and Joint Secretary General Mustafa Noim were present among others.

Mahmudur was arrested at his office in the capital on Thursday on charge of publishing reports on Skype conversation between former International Crimes Tribunal chairman Justice Nizamul Huq and an expatriate Bangladeshi legal expert Ahmed Ziauddin last year.

Seven killed in road crashes

Seven people were killed and six others injured in separate road accidents in the country on Sunday and yesterday.

Our Patuakhali correspondent reports, two people were killed as their motorbike fell into a ditch beside Patuakhali-Kuakata road near Bandra bus stand in Patuakhali on Sunday.

The dead are Ferdouse, 15, and Miraj, 16, of Amtali municipality.

At least six people were injured in three other accidents on the road yesterday.

Abul Bashar Talukder, school inspector of Barisal Education Board, Shahinoor Begum, a teacher, and microbus driver Rajib, were injured when the vehicle fell into a roadside ditch.

Sajib Datta and Lokman sustained injuries when their motorbike fell into a ditch in Amtali area.

Motorcyclist Abu Zafor was also injured when his motorbike fell into a roadside ditch.

Our Jamalpur correspondent adds, a schoolgirl was killed when a bus ran her over at Kumarerchar village in Dewanganj

upazila on Sunday.

Roni Begum, 7, daughter of Nuruzzaman of the village, was a class-II student.

Our Pabna correspondent reports, a schoolboy was killed and five people were injured as a motorbike collided head-on with a human hauler, Nasimon, at Rooppur Jigatola Mor in Ishwardi upazila yesterday.

The deceased is Rakibul Hassan, 13, son of Shahidul Islam Malitha of the upazila, was on the motorbike. The injured were in the Nasimon.

Our Gazipur correspondent adds, an unidentified man, aged around 30, died after a car ran him over in Masterbari area of Gazipur yesterday.

A Bagerhat correspondent reports, a sixth grader was killed when an oncoming truck hit the motorbike carrying him on Kachua-Signboard road in Kachua upazila yesterday.

The victim is Sujit Saha, 11, son of Sujon Saha of the upazila.

Our Dinajpur correspondent adds, Alam Hossain, 50, of Birampur upazila, was killed as a truck hit him on Dinajpur-Birampur road in Hakimpur upazila on Sunday.

BCL attack on female students protested at JU

Several thousand female students of Jahangirnagar University yesterday staged protest programmes on the campus condemning an attack on two female students by ruling party-backed Bangladesh Chhatra League activists on Sunday.

They boycotted classes, brought out a procession and staged a sit-in before the vice-chancellor's office demanding expulsion of the culprits.

The VC said they will decide on the punishment in their syndicate meeting to be held on April 20.

On Sunday, BCL activists brought out a procession at the university on the occasion of Pahela Baishakh. Some activists threw paint at two female students who were passing by the procession.

Following the incident an argument broke out during which some BCL men physically assaulted the female students.

VC Prof Anwar Hossain, among others, rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control.

The victims provided some names to the university authorities but they were not disclosed for proper investigation.


In this regard, Mahmudur Rahman Jony, president of BCL JU unit, said the culprits should be punished regardless of whether they are BCL men or not.


