

# BREACH IN KALAPARA EMBANKMENT

## Saline water damaging watermelons on 2sqkm

Watermelons on about two square kilometers in Kalapara upazila are getting damaged as saline water continues to enter the land through a breached portion of Ramnabad river embankment.

Over 200 metres of the 35km long dyke at Dakkhin (south) Debpur village under Champapur union of the upazila collapsed on Sunday due to heavy pressure of water caused by high tide.

Meanwhile, watermelon

fields, covering over 300 hectares of land have been flooded by saline water in Rangabali upazila of the district as some owners of shrimp enclosures opened sluice gates yesterday morning.

In Kalapara upazila, at least 1,000 farmers cultivated watermelon on the vast tract of land, expecting good earnings. But they are becoming frustrated as saline water is causing damage to the juicy fruit.

While visiting the village yesterday, Jamal Gazi, Sekendar Mollah, Rahim

Mollah, Delwar Mia and Kuddus Mia told this correspondent that they expected to earn Tk 65 to 70 thousand by selling watermelon produced on per bigha of land, but sudden collapse of the dyke has shattered their dreams.

Shau Mia of the village said he cultivated watermelon on eight bighas of land and expected to get at least Tk 6 lakh by selling the fruit within the next seven days. But Saline water has caused extensive damage to watermelon on his four

bighas of land.

Uzzal Mollah, another farmer of the village, said he has to incur huge loss this year as watermelon on his four bighas of land got rotten.

Badiur Rahman, administrator of Champapur Union Parishad, said: "Since soil erosion on the slope of the embankment began last week, I brought the matter to the notices of the local Water Development Board officials. But they did not take any measures to protect the dyke".

Contacted, Executive Engineer Md Shafi Uddin said they, after being informed by the administrator of the union, issued a work order to a contractor to repair the eroded portion of the slope, but he did not do the job in time.

We will repair the damaged portion of the dyke immediately, he added.

In Rangabali upazila, locals alleged that watermelons on 300 hectares of land Chalitabunia union went gone under water yesterday as some influential people led by one Jahidul Islam in the area opened three sluice gates to supply saline water to their shrimp enclosures from a canal.

Contacted, Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) Md Liakat Ali said he was not aware of the matter as nobody filed any complaint to his office.

"If anybody files complaint in this regard, I will investigate the matter and take necessary actions against the persons involved," the UNO added.

# Shibir called hartal in Rajshahi goes almost unheeded

## Clashes with policemen in C'nawabganj

The daylong hartal enforced by Islami Chhatra Shibir went almost unheeded in the district yesterday.

Tight security measures were taken in the city with deployment of a huge number of policemen and Rapid Action Battalion at different points, said SM Moniruzzaman, commissioner of Rajshahi Metropolitan Police, reports our staff correspondent.

Shibir, student wing of Jamaat-e-Islami, on Sunday called the hartal (shutdown) in Rajshahi and Chapainawabganj districts demanding release of its leader Anwarul Islam Masum who, according to Shibir, was picked up by Rab members from his residence at Darikharbona in Rajshahi city on April 4.

Rab, however, refuted that they detained Masum, office secretary of Shibir Rajshahi city unit.

All kinds of vehicles including trains and inter-district buses operated smoothly while government offices including courts were held normally.

All shops and markets remained open and classes

and examinations were held at educational institutions.

In Chapainawabganj, stray incidents of clashes marked the hartal.

Police and witnesses said, the Jamaat-Shibir activists staged demonstration by burning tyres on Chapainawabganj-Rajshahi highway and Chapainawabganj-Sonamasjid land port road at Upar Rajarampur and Shibtala in the town.

They brought out a procession welding bamboo sticks from different areas of the town at around 6:30am, reports our correspondent.

A chase and counter chase took place between police and Jamaat-Shibir activists when they hurled brick chips on policemen at Upar Rajarampur at around 7:30am. They also exploded a few crackers.

Police fired at least eight bullets from short guns to disperse the activists.

Buses remained off the roads in the town.

On Sunday evening, Shibir men torched a passenger bus in Toll Plaza area of Mohananda Bridge in the town to create panic among the people.

# JHENIDAH FEB 28-APR 11

## Jamaat-Shibir men felled over 2235 roadside trees

Activists of Jamaat-e-Islami and its student wing Islami Chhatra Shibir, and main opposition BNP felled down at least 2235 roadside trees to put up road blockade in different upazilas of the district during their violent agitation from February 28 to April 11.

The trees belonged to the Jhenidah Zila Parishad, said Wahed Joarder, administrator of the parishad.

On February 28, Jamaat-Shibir men felled around 1500 trees and left those on eight roads in Jhenidah

district, creating a blockade for a couple of days, zila parishad sources said.

Around 300 roadside trees were felled on March 4-5, around 200 trees on March 18-19 and 200 more on April 4.

Of the felled trees, 1400 were along the highways in Kaliganj and Kotchandpur upazilas, 300 in Sadar upazila, 200 in Harinakundo upazila, 150 in Shaikupa upazila, and 150 in Moheshpur upazila, officials said.

The unruly agitators also vandalised two idols, damaged 10 vehicles and torched two trucks.

### INTRA-PARTY CLASH IN BAUFAL

## BCL, Jubo League leaders injured

Two BCL and Jubo League leaders were injured in an intra-party clash at Baufal upazila town yesterday over organising a fair on Bangla New Year.

They were identified as Morshed, secretary of Baufal town BCL, and his brother Ibrahim Khalil, organising secretary of Baufal upazila Jubo League.

Police and locals said, two rival factions of BCL, one led by Hasan-Jamshed group and another by Nazmul-Morshed group locked in a quarrel over holding a Baishakhi mela at a field in Baufal.

The gang of Saidur Rahman Hasan attacked Morshed with sharp weapons at about 11:00am and hacked his brother Ibrahim Khalil when he came to save

Morshed from the attackers. Locals brought both the injured to Barisal for treatment.

Later police arrested Mehedi, secretary of a BCL faction and Sohag, organising secretary of upazila Jubo League in connection with the clash.

In Laxmipur district, eight people were injured in a clash between the activists of local Jubo League and Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) at Ramganj upazila bus terminal on Saturday afternoon.

The infighting took place over establishing their supremacy in the area, reports UNB.

Several business houses, including the office of upazila Jubo League president Emran Hossain, were vandalised at Nandanpur and Satarpara during the clash.
