## Putin foe trial begins in Russia

Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny went on trial yesterday on charges he says were ordered by President Vladimir Putin to eliminate a top opponent, but the process was swiftly adjourned for a week to allow the defence more time to prepare.

Navalny, who risks up to 10 years in prison in the embezzlement case, has predicted he will be convicted and possibly jailed. Even a suspended sen-

## War-era grenade kills 2 in Vietnam

Two children were killed and six others seriously injured after a grenade left over from the Vietnam War exploded while they were playing with it, police said yesterday.

The children, all 11-year-old classmates, were walking home from school in southern Dak Nong province on Tuesday when they discovered the shell, believed to be from a US-made M79 gre-

## US Senate to hold gun votes

The US Senate were to hold votes on legislation aimed at curbing gun violence, even though senior Democrats are unsure if there is sufficient backing for background checks on firearms sales.

Majority Leader Harry Reid said he scheduled up to nine votes on amendments, including one that expands background checks to all commercial sales, and others that ban assault weapons, restrict the size of ammunition clips and

## China bird flu toll hits 16

H7N9 bird flu has claimed two more lives in Shanghai, Chinese state media said on Tuesday, bringing the death toll from the disease to 16.

China has confirmed 77 human cases of H7N9 avian influenza since announcing two weeks ago that it had found the strain in people for the first time.

The new strain of the flu had been confined to the eastern city of Shanghai and nearby Zhejiang, Jiangsu and Anhui until Saturday when the first

## US drone destroys Pak Taliban base

A US drone fired two missiles into a Taliban training camp in Pakistan yesterday, destroying the compound and killing at least five militants, local officials said.

The attack took place in the Baber Ghar area of the South Waziristan tribal district on the Afghan border, a stronghold of Pakistani Taliban leader Hakimullah Mehsud where the faction runs several camps.

"The target was a base of Pakistani Taliban. Five militants have been killed and two injured," a local security official told AFP.

## Blast targets BJP office in India; 16 hurt

A top Indian official said a blast in the city of Bangalore that wounded 16 people yesterday, including 11 policemen, was "an act of terror" designed to disrupt upcoming state elections.

The explosion, which triggered panic among locals, appeared to have been planted on a motor-bike near the office of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), the main national opposition party which holds power in the southern state of Karnataka, police said.

The explosion took place mid-morning in Malleshwaram, a part of the city referred to as "old" Bangalore and destroyed several surrounding vehicles.

It occurred a short distance from the BJP's state office and opposite a Hindu temple.

India has made efforts to improve domestic security since the 2008 Mumbai attacks, in which 10 Islamist gunmen laid siege to the city, killing 166 people. But experts say security forces still suffer from weak grassroots intelligence gathering.

## Taliban kill 7 Afghan civilians, 4 soldiers

Taliban insurgents in Afghanistan have killed seven civilians with a roadside bomb and cut the throats of four Afghan soldiers kidnapped while travelling home on leave, officials said yesterday.

The civilians were travelling to the town of Shindand in the western province of Herat when their van was torn apart by the blast yesterday, they said.

Seven civilians, including children, were killed and four wounded, the interior ministry said in a statement blaming the Taliban.

Roadside bombings and other explosions are a key weapon used by Taliban and other insurgents against Afghan troops and members of the US-led foreign force. But civilians are often casualties of the blasts.

The bodies of four Afghan soldiers were found yesterday with their throats cut in Jawzjan, a day after they were kidnapped by the Taliban along the road to the northern province, police and officials said.

BENAZIR BHUTTO KILLING  
Pak court extends Musharraf's bail

Pakistan's former military ruler Pervez Musharraf was back in court yesterday to have his bail extended over allegations that he conspired to murder opposition leader Benazir Bhutto in 2007.

Musharraf, who returned home from four years of self-imposed exile last month, arrived at the court in Rawalpindi under tight security as his supporters scuffled with lawyers opposed to the retired general.

Musharraf and his lawyers have been in and out of court numerous times to get his bail extended over the 2007 killing of former prime minister Bhutto, the death of a rebel leader from Baluchistan in 2006 and for arresting judges in 2007.

## Iran-Pak quake toll hits 42

A huge earthquake that struck Iran's rural southeast region killed one woman and injured more than two dozen other people, media reports cited officials as saying yesterday.

In neighbouring Pakistan, the quake killed at least 41 and brought down hundreds of mud-built homes.

According to other Iranian officials cited by the media, Tuesday's 7.8 magnitude quake in the southeastern province of Sistan-Baluchistan also left 27 people injured while more than 20 villages were damaged.

At least eight aftershocks have been recorded, the strongest measuring 5.6 magnitude.

Pakistani survivors of the tremor dug through the rubble of their ruined homes yesterday as the military rushed to send aid to the remote region.

The United States also offered aid after the 7.8-magnitude quake, Iran's most powerful in five decades, damaged an estimated three-quarters of the mud-built homes of Mashail, a town in the dirt-poor Pakistani province of Baluchistan.

United Nations chief Ban Ki-moon also expressed condolences after Tuesday's disaster and said the UN too stood ready to help if needed.

Tuesday's earthquake was felt across the region and though the epicentre lay in southeast Iran, all but one of the deaths reported so far have been across the border in Pakistan.

## Sanjay given 4 more weeks to surrender

India's Supreme Court yesterday gave Bollywood actor Sanjay Dutt, convicted for illegal possession of weapons two decades ago, four more weeks of freedom before returning to jail.

The top court said the relief to Dutt was granted on 'humanitarian grounds.'

The actor, who was convicted by a trial court last month for illegally possessing weapons in a case linked to the 1993 bomb blasts in Mumbai, was to have returned to prison by today. He had applied this week for six months before he began his prison sentence.

The apex court had last month upheld the conviction of Dutt and sentenced him to five years for possessing firearms supplied by men who executed a string of bombings in 1993 that killed 257 people in Mumbai.

Dutt has already served 18 months of his sentence but was released on bail while his case was in appeal.

He now has to serve the remaining three-and-a-half years of his term.
