

HC order on Mahmudur's remand April 21

The High Court yesterday fixed Sunday for passing an order on a writ petition seeking cancellation of Amar Desh Acting Editor Mahmudur Rahman's remand.

His wife Firoza Mahmud filed the petition with the HC on Wednesday challenging the legality of her husband's 13-day remand.

An accused could not be remanded for over three days in a phase, Firoza claimed.

On April 11, Mahmudur was arrested at the daily's office on charge of publishing a Skype conversation.

Khaleda greets Yunus

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia has congratulated Nobel Laureate Prof Muhammad Yunus for achieving the Congressional Gold Medal, the highest civilian award of the United States.

In a message, she said Prof Yunus had dignified the nation once again in the global arena by winning the rare honour.

On Wednesday, leaders of US House and Senate presented Prof Yunus with the medal, which was announced in 2010 in recognition of his efforts in combating global poverty.

Prof Yunus is only the seventh person to have won both the Congressional Gold Medal and the Presidential Medal of Freedom, another highest US civilian award. He won the latter award in 2009.

In her statement, Khaleda Zia pointed out Prof Yunus's various contributions, including conceiving the ideas of microcredit and social business and founding Grameen Bank to empower women and

EC's act of registering Jamaat illegal

Barrister Tania Amir tells HC

The Election Commission's (EC) act of registering Jamaat-e-Islami as a political party was illegal as the party did not believe in the country's constitution, Barrister Tania Amir told the High Court yesterday.

Though a blasphemy law exists in Pakistan, the country's EC prohibits political parties from using religion as a political tool. But Bangladesh's EC registered Jamaat "although it uses religion as a political tool", she said.

Tania was placing arguments in favour of a writ petition during the third day's

hearing on a January 27, 2009 HC rule over the registration's legality.

The rule, issued following the filing of the writ petition, asked Jamaat's ameer and secretary general and the EC to explain why the party's registration should not be declared illegal.

The HC bench of Justice M Moazzam Hossain, Justice M Enayetur Rahim and Quazi Reza-Ul Hoque adjourned the hearing till April 23.

The petition was filed with the HC on January 25, 2009 by Bangladesh Tariqat Federation's Secretary General Rezaul Haque Chandpuri and 24 others challenging the legality of Jamaat's registration.

Man's body found in six pieces

Police recovered six dismembered body parts of a man from the bank of the river Buriganga in Munshirhati area of the capital's Kamrangirchar yesterday.

The hands, legs, head and the upper torso were found inside a sack and two polythene bags, said Sub-inspector of Kamrangirchar Police Station Nurul Islam.

The lower torso of the unidentified man believed to be around 35 years of age is missing. The SI suspects that the body was chopped up into pieces early yesterday and was dumped on the river bank. Police sent the chopped remains to Sir Salimullah Medical College morgue for autopsy.

Jamaat atrocities attempt to 'grab' state power

Sultana Kamal tells journalists

The countrywide atrocities of Jamaat-Shibir and some of their associate political organisations are nothing but attempts to "grab" state power, said eminent rights activist Sultana Kamal yesterday.

"It is absolutely clear that they have unleashed the violence not out of their love for religion," she told a press conference organised by Bangladesh Rukhe Darao, a civil society members' platform, in Dhaka Reporters Unity.

The platform leaders announced to hold a national convention in the capital's Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh tomorrow at 10:00am to press home their five-point demand, including banning Jamaat-e-Islami and Islami Chhatra Shibir.

They also demanded to expedite the war crimes trial; resist communal violence and support victims; take the country forward based on the Liberation War's spirit and allow free thinking; resist ill-attempts to turn the country into a Taliban-style state and uphold women's rights.

Sultana Kamal, the platform's convening committee member, demanded that Jamaat, as an organisation, be held responsible for committing war crimes as it publicly opposed the 1971 Liberation War.

"They are desecrating the national flag and vandalising Shaheed Minars. This kind of treason is beyond forgiveness," she said.

Schoolgirl 'commits suicide'

A schoolgirl allegedly committed suicide at her Rajarbagh residence in the capital's Sabujbagh area early yesterday.

According to family members, they found Chaity hanging from the window grill of her room with a scarf around 2:30am.

They rushed her to Dhaka Medical College Hospital where doctors declared her dead.

Diplomats should learn from 1971

Says Dipu Moni

Foreign Minister Dipu Moni yesterday urged young diplomats of the country to take lessons from their predecessors who fought on the diplomatic front for the nation's independence in 1971.

"The spirit of 1971 makes comebacks repeatedly and we should be imbued with it to overcome all adverse situations," she told a discussion at the foreign ministry marking the establishment of the first independent mission of Bangladesh in Kolkata on this day in 1971.

Mohammad Hossain Ali, the then deputy high commissioner, with 65 Bangladeshi officials and employees pledged allegiance to the Mujibnagar government and hoisted the Bangladesh flag at the deputy high commission replacing the Pakistan flag on April 18, 1971.

Dipu Moni said the Bangladeshi diplomats stationed in different foreign mission, including Washington, London and Paris, worked hard also in the post-war period to secure recognition from international communities of an independent Bangladesh.
