JnU students raise 5-point demand

Jagannath University (JnU) students continued demonstrating for the second consecutive day yesterday to press home their five-point demand including recovery of nine dormitories occupied by grabbers.

Several thousand agitating students under the banner "Jagannath University General Students" yesterday boycotted classes, brought out several processions, set fires to tyres and used those as road blockades near the campus area and laid siege to the vice-chancellor's office.

The other demands of the students are starting construction of new dormitories within seven working days, solving transport crisis, easing session jam and accounting for Tk 100 crore, which was

allocated by the government for the university's development.

The agitating students also arranged a press conference at the office of *JnU Journalist Association* where they announced their new protest programmes including road blockade in *Rayshab Bazar* area.

Prof Mijanur Rahman, vice-chancellor of the university, said "We fully agree with the demands of the students as those are logical and we are trying to meet the demands. But the students should realise that it is not possible to build buildings overnight, it takes time."

The VC further added that the students are not helping themselves by boycotting classes and exams as they themselves are creating session jams.

"SAYEDEE'S FACE ON MOON"

Lack of science knowledge led to belief: Inu

Lack of knowledge about science was the only reason that led thousands of people to take to the streets believing that the face of a war crimes convict was seen on the moon, said Information Minister Hasanul Haq Inu yesterday.

He was referring to the March 3 incident when, seeing a fabricated Facebook picture of *Delawar Hossain Sayedee's* face superimposed on a picture of the moon, many people believed the picture was real and was a sign from God.

No practice of science is possible if the society is not freed from the clutches of pseudo religious scholars, he said.

Inu was addressing a book launching ceremony at the *Bangladesh Nuclear Energy Centre* auditorium in the capital. The book, "Maha Biswer Pathe Pathe", by Russo Taher was launched there.

"Those who are taking a position against the progress of women are actually against the progress of human beings," he said.

Without participation of women and knowledge about science, no progress is possible, he added.
