## CLIMATE CHANGE Victims relate it differently

*Finds survey in 10 districts*

To Ambia Begum, who lives in a char in the Jamuna in Kurigram, climate change is river erosion and floods that have gobbled up her homestead several times.

"We can have our meals only if my husband can earn. We face severe difficulties during floods for he finds no work then," Ambia, wife of a farmer rendered landless, said when asked what she understood by climate change and if she had ever experienced it.

Surveying as many as 2,649 people like Ambia from 10 districts, a perception report on climate change finds that different people interpret climate change in different ways.

But all of those surveyed know about climate change and 80 percent of them said they had faced losses, especially in cultivation, due to its impacts.

The survey found that people interpreted climate change as per natural hazards they face in their

# Cleared for release, not to be released

The last British resident being held in Guantánamo Bay may never be allowed to return to his family in London because of an alleged "secret deal" between US authorities, Saudi Arabia and the British security services.

Shaker Aamer, 46, has been in the Cuban detention centre for more than 11 years without charge or trial, and has been cleared for release since 2007.



This month, two Metropolitan police detectives interviewed Aamer, gathering an estimated 150 pages of testimony and allegations that MI5 and MI6 were complicit in his

torture. These included claims that a British officer was present while US soldiers tortured him and that MI6 officers made allegations to the CIA they knew to be false, including that Aamer was a member

## 3 JAMAAT LEADERS Tribunal brings contempt charges

International Crimes Tribunal-2 yesterday initiated contempt proceedings against three top Jamaat-e-Islami leaders for making "provocative and derogatory remarks" about the tribunal.

The three-member tribunal led by Justice Obaidul Hassan also directed the Jamaat leaders to come up with their reply, if they have any, by May 9 as to why they would not be punished for violating section 11 (4) of the International Crimes (Tribunals) Act, 1973.

Section 11 (4) says: "A tribunal may punish any person, who obstructs or abuses its process or disobeys any of its orders or directions or does anything which tends to prejudice the case of a party before it or tends to bring it or any of its members into hatred or contempt or does anything which constitutes contempt of the tribunal..."

The three Jamaat leaders are acting secretary general Rafiqul Islam Khan, central executive council member
