Chinese, European Commission presidents greet Abdul Hamid

Black flags at religious institutions urged denouncing communalism

Today's strike at DU called off

On April 17, they called a strike on the campus demanding release of the arrested bloggers.

Rafique Ullah Khan, professor of the Bangla department and one of the key organisers of the movement, said they will announce their next programme within some days.

Law enforcers arrested four bloogers -- Subrata Adhikari Shuvo, also a master's student of the Bangla department of DU; Russel Parvez, Mashiur Rahman Biplob, and Asif Mohiuddin -- for allegedly hurting religious sentiment via social

commuter train

The first-ever commuter train in the country hit the Dhaka-Narayanganj tracks yesterday to ensure faster travel on the 20-kilometre route.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina inaugurated the sixcoach Diesel Electric Multiple Unit (DEMU) train at Kamalapur Railway Station in the capital.

Railways Minister Mujibul Haq, Home Minister Muhiuddin Khan Alamgir and Bangladesh Railway Director General Abu Taher were also present on the occasion.

The train departed the Kamalapur station at 1:25pm and reached Narayanganj at 2:00pm.

The train, which can carry 300 passengers at a time, will make 14 trips daily on the route.

Although the DEMU train can run at a speed of 80 kilometres per hour, it was running much slower due to presence of slums, bazars and level crossings at various points on the route, said Abu Taher.

The DEMU train is the first of a total of 20 trains being imported from China as per a \$58.31 million deal signed in 2011.

The railway is also importing five six-coach DEMU trains from India, which will start supplying the trains by the end of this year.

The government is planning to introduce commuter trains on short routes across the country.

PM inaugurates first Condolences pour in for Savar victims

President Abdul Hamid, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia, Acting Speaker Shawkat Ali and many political parties and organisations expressed deep condolence at the death of those killed in a building collapse in Savar yesterday.

They prayed for the salvation of the departed souls and expressed deep sympathy to their family members and to the injured.

Ruling Awami League-led 14-party coalition, Workers' Party of Bangladesh, Gonoforum, Zaker Party, Ain o Salish Kendra, and several student organisations also demanded arrest and punishment of the owners of the building and the garment factories inside the high rise.

The organisations also demanded that the government compensate the families of the victims and carry out an extensive probe into the incident.

Communist Party of Bangladesh termed the collapse "a planned murder" and demanded arrest of the culprits within 24 hours. Transparency International Bangladesh and Bikolpodhara Bangladesh demanded a judicial probe into the incident.

The Dhaka Chamber of Commerce and Industry urged all to join the rescue operation to save the victims.

TEMPLE ARSON IN CTG Buddhists seek protection from deputy commissioner

Buddhists expressed anxiety and sought protection from Chittagong Deputy Commissioner Abdul Mannan during his visit to a burnt Buddhist temple and orphanage in Patiya upazila of Chittagong yesterday.

Dhatu Chaittya Bihar in Mukut Knight village mysteriously caught fire on April 20 and the following day its orphanage was burnt down.

Mannan gave assurance of safety to the Buddhist community there and directed Shafiqul Islam, assistant superintendent of police of Patiya circle, and Rokeya Parveen, upazila nirbahi officer, to submit probe report on the incident by April 29.

Mannan also handed over Tk 10,000 for the orphans. Meanwhile, police arrested four persons in Boalkhali upazila in the last two days for their alleged involvement in robbery and arson attack on a Buddhist temple, Shakaymuni Bihar.

BISMILLAH GROUP LOAN SCAM ACC grills Jamuna

The Anti-Corruption Commission yesterday interrogated four high officials of Jamuna Bank for allegedly assisting the controversial Bismillah Group in loan scams.

The four are the bank's Managing Director Matiur Rahman, Vice-President Mahibul Kadir, Senior Assistant Vice-President Younus Ali, and Executive Officer Rezaul Islam.

A four-member ACC team led by its Deputy Director Syed Iqbal Hossain interrogated the four at the commission's Segunbagicha office in the capital.

"In the preliminary interrogation we just verified docu-

ments," Iqbal said refusing to disclose further details. He said Bismillah Group, using fake documents, took loans of around Tk 1,100 crore from five banks -- Jamuna Bank, Prime Bank, Shahjalal Islami Bank, Janata Bank

NOISE POLLUTION IN CAPITAL Level double than permissible: Poba

and Premier Bank.

Noise pollution levels around the capital's "quiet, residential, industrial, commercial and mixed zones" in April were nearly double the maximum limits allowed by the Noise Pollution (Control) Rules 2006, stated a Poribesh Bachao Andolon (Poba) report yesterday.

The report, "Current state of noise pollution in Dhaka city: Steps to take", prepared following a Poba survey, was unveiled during a press conference in Poba's Kalabagan office in the capital. As per the rules, the maximum daytime noise limit for "quiet zones", defined as any area with hospitals, educational institutions, offices and related organisations within a 100-metre radius, is 50 decibels, says the report.

However, noise levels around Shahid Zia Girls' School and College in Jatrabari, and National Institute of Kidney Diseases and Urology and National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases in Sher-e-Bangla Nagar were recorded at 100 and 97 decibels respectively, it said.

"Noise pollution can hamper people's mental and physical development. The worst affected are children, pregnant women and heart patients," said Poba Secretary Mohammad Abdus Sobhan. The penalty provisions of a maximum six-month jail

sentence or fines worth Tk 10,000 or more for offenders,

as stated by the rules, are hardly enforced, he said.
