Kidnapped girl rescued

Police have rescued a Hindu schoolgirl, who was kidnapped about two months ago from Baufal village. Police rescued her from Matuail of Jatrabari in Dhaka on Friday night and arrested two people in this connection. The arrestees are Feroz alias Nayan, 20, son of Ruhul Bayatee of Birpasha village and Forkan, 25, of the same village. Family and police sources said, Feroz alias Nayan, wanted to marry the 14-year-old girl of class eight but her family refused the proposal. On February 5, a gang led by Nayan kidnapped the girl from in front of her house. The gang kidnapped my daughter and Nayan married her forcibly after converting her into a Muslim, father of the victim claimed.

Housewife murdered

A housewife was stabbed to death allegedly by her husband and in-laws at Satpakia village in Sadar upazila on Friday. The deceased was identified as Dilruba Begum, 35. Police and witnesses said Dilruba's husband Uzzal Miah and her in-laws stabbed her following a family feud, leaving her critically injured in the morning. She was first taken to Jamalpur General Hospital and then shifted to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital where she succumbed to her wounds in the afternoon. Victim's father Dudu Miah filed a murder case.

Two electrocuted

Two people died from electrocution at Paranganj village in Sadar upazila yesterday. The deceased were identified as Jahangir Alam, son of Mofiz Uddin of Dakir Kanda village, and Sarwar Alam, son of Samar Ali of Baghadoba village of the same upazila. Officer in-charge (OC) of Mymensingh Model police station Fazlul Karim said, Sarwar got injured when he came in contact with a live electric wire lying on a road on Saturday night following a storm. Jahangir also was injured when he went to save Sarwar. Local people rushed the two to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital where they succumbed to their injuries in the morning.

Stop fratricidal conflict among political parties in CHT

Urge citizens' bodies in Rangamati, Bandarban

Leaders of Chittagong Hill Tracts Citizen's Committee (CHTCC) yesterday brought out a procession in the town and formed a human chain in New Court Building area calling to stop 'fratricidal conflict' between the local political parties.

Shun polities of killing and abduction, practice democracy. Organise all political programmes in a peaceful manner. Killing and kidnapping own brothers cannot resolve any problem, said the leaders of the citizen" body.

We want to live in peace, so hold dialogue across the table for your own interest, they said, pointing at propeace Parbattya Chattagram Jana Sanghati Samity (PCJSS), anti-peace treaty United People's Democratic Front (UPDF) and Manabendra Narayan Larma faction of PCJSS.

Violation of human rights in the hills is on the rise and it has become a regular phenomenon in the recent days. Killing and kidnapping by the three factions --PCJSS, UPDF and MN Larma -- is taking place in the region almost every other day.

Jumma people are being killed by their own brothers, many women are becoming widow while youths becoming orphans, they lamented.

Campaign heats up for Magura mayoral by-poll

The by-election is scheduled to be held on May 6.

The mayoral post fell vacant following the death of former Mayor Mohammad Altaf Hossain. The last municipality election was held on 27 January 2011.

The candidates in the fray are: Khurshid Haider Tutul (AL backed), Tapon Roy (AL rebel group backed), Dr. Mahbubul Haque Siddiquee (BNP backed), Iqbal Akhter Khan (BNP rebel group backed) and advocate Hasan Seraj Suja (Jatiys Party backed).

Dedicated leaders of both AL and BNP have expressed their frustration over their respective party's rebel candidatures.

Contacted, Dr. Mohammad Serajul Akbar, MP as well as the general secretary of Magura district unit AL, however said, "Tapon Roy did not seek party support as he resigned from the party in 2012. Four others sought backing in writing from the party and three of them withdrew their candidacy in support of Khurshid Haider Tutul". President of district unit

BNP Kabir Murad told this correspondent, "Kafur was never a BNP candidate as he did not hold any party post. Our party has unanimously decided to back Dr. Mahbubul Haque

Siddiquee", he added. As the candidates of both major parties are facing internal feud, JP backed candidate advocate Hasan Seraj Suja is enjoying its advantage. Moreover, there is no squabble or confusion

in his organisation. "As our candidate advocate Suja has a clean image and the party is out of any internal conflict, we hope to be able to achieve our target to win the municipal mayoral post", said Khan Ziaul Haque, president of district unit JP.

Hefajat holds meeting in Kushtia today defying ban

Hefajat-e-Islami has declared that it would hold a public meeting in the district today defying a ban by the local administration on any gathering.

The Hefajat leader said that they sought permission on April 18 to hold the meeting on Kushtia public library ground on April 28. But on Saturday, the local

administration informed them that they cannot hold the meeting, he said.

Contacted, Additional Police Superintendent Joynal Abedin told this correspondent that police did not grant permission to them for fear of deterioration of law and order.

Meanwhile, police deployed additional forces at different points of the town.

The Islamist organisation will hold a grand rally on Eidgah ground in Tangail tomorrow to press their 13point demand.

Tangail district unit of the organisation held a press conference at Dhulerchar Madrasa in the town yesterday to brief local journalists about the programme, reports our correspondent.

Mufti Abdur Rahman, member secretary of the district unit Hefajat, read out the announcement.

The leaders of the organisation said that Hefajat-e-Islam is a non-political organisation and so it has no political agenda. In Dinajpur, Hefajat

leaders at a rally yesterday said that the Awami League government had no right to stay in power any further as they failed to run the country smoothly.

They also asked the government to quit power before May 5, reports our correspondent.
