

Piss off Goetze, say BvB fans

Borussia Dortmund fans showed their disgust over Mario Goetze's decision to join Bayern Munich during the Bundesliga game between the two sides on Saturday.

The Dortmund midfielder, considered one of the hottest prospects in world football, will join Bayern in the summer after the Munich giants activated his 32 million pound release clause.

The 20-year-old will, in the process, become the most expensive German player in the history of the game.

Goetze missed this weekend's clash with Bayern with a hamstring strain but is hoping to play when the two sides clash again in the Champions League final later this month.

In the stands Dortmund fans unveiled a large banner which read: "Striving for money shows how big your heart really is. Piss off Goetze," while fans taped over his name and number on replica shirts.

On the pitch tempers flared in a 1-1 draw which was anything but a friendly warm-up for the bigger clash in three weeks time.

Ajax win third on the trot

Ajax Amsterdam clinched their 32nd Dutch soccer league title on Sunday after first-half goals by Kolbeinn Sigthorsson and Christian Eriksen set up a comfortable 5-0 home win over bottom side Willem II Tilburg.

With one match remaining, Ajax have 73 points, four more than PSV Eindhoven who stay on track for a Champions League qualifying berth following a 4-2 win over NEC Nijmegen.

Tilburg were relegated after suffering their 21st defeat.

Iceland's Sigthorsson opened the scoring after 12 minutes with a well-executed diving header following a fine cross from Ryan Babel.

A blunder from Tilburg keeper David Meul, who let a long drive from Eriksen slip through his hands, allowed Ajax to double the lead after 25 minutes.

Viktor Fischer, Siem de Jong and Danny Hoesen scored after the interval as the capacity home crowd of 50,000 celebrated.

Wenger happy with momentum

Arsene Wenger believes the momentum is now with Arsenal in the battle to claim a place in next season's Champions

League.

Wenger's Arsenal side moved back up to third place following a 1-0 victory at relegated Queens Park Rangers, two points clear of Chelsea ahead of Rafael Benitez's side's trip to face Manchester United.

Unbeaten in eight games, they now have two games remaining and the manager believes maximum points will ensure his side finish in the top four.

"We are on a very strong run," said the manager. "We are ready for a fight and the team is highly focused to do it.

"Definitely the momentum is there. If you look at the points we have made compared to two months ago we are going for it and we make the points.

"Away from home we have won everywhere. We have also had lots of derbies and they are difficult to win."

He added: "I cannot even tell you what results I wish for from the others (Tottenham and Chelsea). A long time ago we focused on us getting the maximum points.

"We have done that nearly because we dropped two points against Everton and Manchester United but we want to win every game and we want to concentrate

on doing that."

Theo Walcott struck the decisive goal after just 20 seconds, following up his strike against Manchester United last time out for his 20th goal of the season.

It was the fastest goal of the English Premier League season.

And Wenger believes the winger's scoring return is a reflection of his growing maturity.

"He is 24 now, he is a mature player. He

has improved his finishing, he is an improved player," said Wenger.

"His ability to resist an opponent is better, it was similar goal to the one against United."

But Wenger admitted his side had shown some nerves as they were made to work hard for the win by a Rangers side who are facing next season playing in the Championship.

Bayern Munich and Borussia Dortmund both rested their stars as the Champions League final dress rehearsal ended in a 1-1 draw, but Dortmund captain Sebastian Kehl has said he expects an explosive affair in Wembley.

Bayern had already been crowned Bundesliga champions four weeks ago and the point guaranteed Dortmund second place, so Saturday's German league clash at Signal Iduna Park was little more than a warm-up for the May 25 final.

An early goal by Dortmund wing Kevin Grosskreutz was cancelled out when Mario Gomez was left unmarked at the far post on 23 minutes to head Munich level.

But there was second-half drama as

Bayern goalkeeper Manuel Neuer saved Robert Lewandowski's penalty before Munich left-back Rafinha was shown a red card for elbowing Dortmund's Jakub Blaszczykowski in the face.

"It will be an all together more explosive match in three weeks' time," said Kehl.

"Today's game won't be comparable with how things will be at Wembley.

"Unfortunately, we didn't manage to win the game, despite a lot of chances."

Dortmund ended Bayern's 14-match winning streak in the Bundesliga as Munich dropped league points for the first time since December and coach Jupp Heynckes said the midweek Champions League win at Barcelona had taken its toll.

Bayern beat the Spaniards 3-0 for a 7-0 aggregate triumph.

"After the results of the last few weeks, it wasn't easy to get back to business," said the 67-year-old, whose side is bidding to become the first German team to win the European, league and cup treble.

"It was an intense game in which neither side gave anything away.

"A few people had said it would be a boring game because several Bayern players were missing, but that wasn't the case.

"I must praise the team, they



fought hard, even with 10 men and they deserved the points."

Although Bayern beat Borussia 1-0 in the German Cup quarter-finals in February, the Bavarians have failed to beat their rivals in six

Bundesliga attempts -- their last league win was back in February 2010.

There is no love lost between the Bundesliga rivals and a heated argument between Bayern's director of sport Matthias Sammer and Dortmund coach Jurgen Klopp broke out in the wake of Rafinha's dismissal.

Referee Peter Gagelmann had to lecture the pair to restore order.

"No one came here thinking it would be a friendly," said Klopp, whose side booked their Wembley berth with a 4-3 win on aggregate against Real Madrid in their Champions League semi-final.

"Sammer had said I should leave Rafinha alone, then I said something back, before Mr Gagelmann ordered us to shake hands.

"It was a very intense game - everyone was still in tournament mode.

"We started very well, but there were too many moments where we played far too little football.

"We got a point, the point that we needed to make sure we finish second, so we have reached a goal for the season."

Juventus champions

Arturo Vidal's 10th league goal of the season was enough to secure a 1-0 win over Palermo and help ten-man Juventus to their 29th Serie A title on Sunday.

Juventus now have a 14-point lead over second-placed Napoli, who, even in the event of a win over Inter Milan later Sunday, can not overtake the Turin giants in the final three games of the season.

Chilean international Vidal had been Juve's top scorer this season, the attacking midfielder scoring nine in the league and

home to Real Valladolid in La Liga.

A hero to Real fans and club captain for more than a decade, Casillas has barely featured since recovering from a broken hand, with Mourinho preferring to stick with Diego Lopez, who was brought in as cover from Sevilla in January.

Mourinho has hinted he may leave at the end of the season and he appeared to confirm reports his relationship with Casillas had broken down with a series of barbed comments in a news conference on Friday.

He said he regretted not buying Lopez earlier in his three-year stint in the Spanish capital and that he could not work with players who "think they are above the rest".

Fans at the Bernabeu on Saturday made their feelings clear when Casillas's name was roundly cheered when it was read out among the list of substitutes, while Mourinho was whistled by a significant section of the crowd.

The sense that all is not well at the club following Tuesday's elimination from the Champions League was heightened after the game when Pepe, Mourinho's

Portuguese compatriot, criticised the coach in a television interview.

Pepe's comments were particularly surprising given that he and Mourinho share the same agent.

"In my opinion, maybe the coach's words (on Friday) were not entirely appropriate," he told broadcaster Canal Plus.

"We have to show a bit more respect for Iker," he added.

"Iker is a player who is part of Madrid, he is an institution. In this club and in Spain. He has to know that we the players

are with him."

As has become customary when Real win a league match, Mourinho sent out his assistant Aitor Karanka to give the post-match news conference on Saturday.

Asked about the fans' reaction to Mourinho, Karanka said it had to be respected.

He declined to comment on why Mourinho had unusually elected not to emerge from the dugout during the match.

"We have a Cup final and we want to give the title to our fans."

Chelsea shoot to third spot

Juan Mata struck an 87th-minute winner as Chelsea won 1-0 at champions Manchester United on Sunday to reclaim third place in the Premier League and tighten their grip on a Champions League spot.

A lacklustre game at Old Trafford was drifting towards a goalless draw when Mata collected a pass from Oscar and dispatched a low shot that took a deflection off Phil Jones on its way into the bottom-right corner.

Mata's goal means that Chelsea will now go into Wednesday's crunch clash against Tottenham Hotspur at Stamford Bridge with a three-point lead over their London rivals, who are bidding to crash into the top four.

Arsenal are sandwiched between the pair in fourth, a point behind Chelsea, having played a game more.

United had right-back Rafael da Silva sent off late on and although their lead over second-place Manchester City remains 13 points, they have failed to win in two games since clinching their 20th league title.

United manager Alex Ferguson conceded his side "weren't good enough", but he felt Rafael had been reacting to an elbow from David Luiz when he was sent off by referee Howard Webb.

"He was elbowled. He retaliated, and the player who retaliates always gets the bigger penalty," Ferguson told Sky Sports.

United made five changes from the side that drew 1-1 at Arsenal last weekend, with Rio Ferdinand, Wayne Rooney and goalkeeper David de Gea among the players dropping to the bench.
