Hefajat's havoc condemned

Different socio-political and cultural organisations yesterday condemned the mayhem created by the activists of Hefajat-e Islam in the capital on Sunday.

Teamed up with Jamaat-Shibir men, the activists set ablaze dozens of shops selling Islamic books and even Holy Quran among many other makeshift stalls on footpaths around Baitul Mukarram mosque.

The organisations which expressed the condemnations include Sector Commanders Forum, Liberation War-'71; Bangladesh Udichi Shilpigoshthi, Citizens Rights Movement, Bangladesh Jubo Moitree, Muktijoddha Oikya Parishad, Bangladesh Shommilito Islami Jote and Joy Bangla Sangskritik Oikya Jote.

In the statements, leaders of the organisations said the acts of Hefajat clearly contradict to the true sense of Islam.

Condemning such anti-Islamic and anti-social activities in the name of Islam, they said Islam is a peaceful religion; and it never allows creating such anarchy and burn the Holy Quran.

In its statement, Sector Commanders Forum said the atrocities done by Hefajat activists remind the nation the time of the country's Liberation War.

The ways of creating unrest and anarchy resembles with the atrocities of Pakistani occupation forces in 1971, it said.

HC verdict tomorrow on DCC polls

Savar municipality's two engineers land in jail

Savar municipality's two engineers, who were arrested in connection with two cases filed over the Rana Plaza collapse, were sent to jail after they were produced before a Dhaka court yesterday.

Police produced the municipality's Executive Engineer Emtemam Hossain and Assistant Engineer Alam Miah before the court on completion of their eightday remand in the cases.

Senior Judicial Magistrate Wasim Sheikh passed the order as police did not seek further remand.

Moreover, no lawyers stood to defend them as Dhaka Bar Association had earlier decided not to give any legal assistance to them including the collapsed building's owner Sohel Rana.

In the yesterday's forwarding report, Detective Branch of police Inspector and also the cases' investigation officer Mir Shahin Shah Parvez said the information derived from arrestees was being verified, and they should be confined to jail until the end of the investigation.

On April 24, the building was collapsed that led at least 622 garment workers to death and maimed a number of workers.

Kaikobad helped people since childhood

Say family members; his body arrives from Singapore

The Rana Plaza collapse rescue worker Kaikobad, who died in Singapore Saturday after suffering burns during a rescue operation on April 28, had always braved dangers in helping people since his childhood, family members said yesterday. They said he never thought of his life while

trying to help the helpless people in danger.

Mohammad Ezazuddin Chowdhury Kaikobad, 35, was burnt in a fire inside the rubble of Rana Plaza while trying to rescue Shaheena Akhtar, a garment worker who could not be saved in the end. He was admitted to Dhaka Combined Military Hospital (CMH) and later flown to Singapore on April 30.

Kaikobad is survived by her wife Jarmeen Akhter and a daughter, 7, and son, 4.

Family members received his body at

Shahjalal International Airport yesterday. Speaking to reporters at the airport, Kaikobad's elder sister Sultana Razia said, "My brother was mad about doing good for people whenever he saw anyone in danger."

The widow Jarmeen Akter said she had talked to her husband on only one of the five days he had worked tirelessly to rescue trapped garment workers since the April 24 collapse. "He told me he could not come home. If he did, he could not save any life."

Jarmeen said she was worried about the future of her two children, as their father could not leave any capital.

Kaikobad's body was kept at the CMH's mortuary. He will be buried at the Banani graveyard with state honour after his second namaz-e-janaza on Central Army Mosque premises following Zohr prayers today.

Stop use of residential buildings for industries

Experts tell Prothom Alo roundtable

Deadly building collapses may recur unless the government immediately identifies and stops the illegal use of residential buildings for readymade garments factories and other industries, leading civil engineers said at a discussion yesterday.

The government should make it mandatory for every owner to display approval and occupancy certificate in a way so that anyone can check its authenticity through mobile phone using "quick search code" technology, said Eng Prof Jamilur Reza Chowdhury.

The Bangla daily Prothom Alo organsied

Prof Jamilur said the fire service depart-

ment should build up standard search

and rescue teams, including engineers and physicians, while Rajdhani Unnyan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) should disaggregate too much responsibility it had taken upon itself for development control and real estate development simultaneously.

Rajuk should immediately survey the buildings housing industries and measure their vulnerability, as 70 percent of the capital's buildings are nonengineered, said architect Iqbal Habibn, member secretary of the environmentalist group Bapa.

Rajuk Chairman Nurul Huda said they could not enforce building rules in municipality areas within the capital city's jurisdiction in the face of "vehement opposition" by Savar, Tongi and Narayanganj municipality authorities.

SAVAR BUILDING COLLAPSE VICTIMS Indian, German govts offer rehab help

The Indian and German governments yesterday offered assistance to rehabilitate the Savar building collapse victims to help the disabled persons regain their mobility, enabling them to lead a life in dignity and again work for their living.

The Indian government would sponsor, facilitate and arrange for the rehabilitation of the victims who lost limbs or were seriously injured using world renowned expertise available in India, said an India High Commission press release.

The German government will provide Tk 50 lakh taka to support some of the victims.

Moreover, financial assistance will also be given to victims or their families for accommodation, food and transport cost, said a German embassy press release.

The German Red Cross and the International Committee of the Red Cross will implement the project. The Centre for the Rehabilitation of the Paralysed located in Savar will be included in the project concept and implementation.

The victims will also receive work rehabilitation support through skills development training.
