

4 fruits of foreign varieties to earn forex, meet local demand

Bangladesh Agricultural University (BAU) Germ Plasm Centre, second largest fruit repository in the world, has a great potentiality of developing fruits of foreign varieties, enriched with nutritional value.

One of the largest such repository can be seen in Miami, USA, according to researchers here.

In recent years, the BAU centre has released four new varieties of foreign fruits for the farmers. These varieties -- Santol from Thailand, Rambutan from Indonesia, Dragon Fruit from Vietnam and Persimon from Japan -- have added extra attractions to the huge garden.

The centre now draws the attention of a large number of local and foreign visitors. The scientists hope that these four foreign varieties of fruits will soon be commercially cultivated in the country.

Rambutan, a South-East Asian fruit, (grown mostly in Malaysia, the Philippines and Thailand) has huge demand all over the world and it will be the main fruit item for export to those three countries, sources said.

These four foreign varieties are harvested between May and November when local fruits are rarely available in the market.

The demand for the foreign variety fruits is also high in the capital city and district towns as well, said Prof. Dr. Md. Abdur Rahim, director of the centre.

"Our rich soil is perfect for cultivation of these varieties to ease pressure on imported fruits," he said.

"To meet local nutritional demand and earn foreign exchange, the production of these fruits could be of great help," the director went on.

The centre collected the four foreign varieties in 1999 and started producing saplings in 2007, said Dr. Rahim.

It has also produced 10,000 saplings of the varieties and most of them have been given to the farmers through distribution channels since 2007, he added.

The Dragon Flower has become popular, especially among the farmers of Chittagong and Mongla areas, as it also grows well in saline soil.

The centre started its journey with 74 fruit trees of 10 varieties in 1991. It is now furnished with over 11,000 fruit trees of 700 varieties, including 50 foreign varieties from 44 countries of the world. Dr. Rahim was appointed as an 'investigator' at the centre at its inception, sources said.

Nearly extinct 63 varieties like *boichi*, *dumur*, *dewa*, *paniwalla*, *betul*, *gaab*, *chalta* and *arboroi* has also given the germ plasm centre further variation. Over 10,000 farmers of different districts have been trained on country and foreign varieties of fruits since 2007, they said.

Mithu, Senior Research Associate, said that if the foreign varieties are enriched properly and cultivated widely, fruits will be available round the year to meet up the nutritional demand.

The centre needs adequate financial support from the government for more research work, he said.

Visually impaired since birth, four underprivileged youths are attending the ongoing HSC examinations at Pabna Government Women's College centre as private candidates, thanks to their determination and initiative of humanitarian organisation Manob Kalyan Trust.

The four examinees are Shaheb Ali of Char Malshapara village in Sirajganj, Moniruzzaman of Brammanpara village in Narshindi, Md Monsur Ali of Rajabari village in Godagari of Rajshahi and Alhaz Uddin of Kuthibari village in Khoksha of Kushtia.

"With special permission from the education board they are appearing at the examinations, being aided by persons who write answer scripts as per dictation. A special room has been allotted for them," said Md Shafikul Islam, acting principal of Pabna

Government Women's College.

Shaheb Ali passed the SSC in 1999, Moniruzzaman and Md Monsur Ali in 2008 and Alhaz Uddin in 2011 but they discontinued study due to family hardship, said Prof Md Abul Hossain, chairman of Manob Kalyan Trust.

"In last year our organisation arranged their boarding and facilities for resumption of study here. And we have succeeded in helping them appear at this year's HSC examinations with private registration. We are hopeful about their good results and success in life," he said.

"I had to discontinue study in 1999 due to poverty but now I am attending the HSC with good preparation. I have a dream to be a lawyer," said Md Shaheb Ali, one of the four examinees.

The three others also expressed their vision of success through education.

ACC files charge sheets in 8 cases

Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) here submitted charge sheets in eight cases filed against 15 people of different government offices on charge of embezzlement of funds and foodgrains in three districts under Rangpur division.

At a press briefing on Monday noon at Rangpur ACC office, the officials said, three Rangpur Sugar Mills Limited officials at Mahimaganj under Gobindaganj upazila of Gaibandha district embezzled Tk 1,32,13,225 from the mill in six years.

Siddique Ali, former manager (admin) lodged a case in this connection with ACC on 14 July, 2010.

After investigation, Nure-Alam, assistant director at ACC Rangpur office, however, found that Md. Abdullah, assistant accounts officer, Abul Foyez, former manager and deputy general manager and Rafiqul Islam, former accounts assistant of the sugar mill embezzled Tk 1,25,51,685 from the mill.

ACC submitted charge sheet in six cases against them with the Chief Judicial Magistrate Court in Gaibandha on 15 April 2013.

In Kurigram, AKM Aminur Islam, education officer of Kurigram Sadar upazila, lodged a case on July 7, 2011 with ACC Rangpur office against Maidul Islam Shuvo, Abu Salek, Md. Adit Rochi, Md. Asaduddaula, assistant teachers of Gopalpur Government

Primary School in Kurigram Sadar upazila, Lal Mian, MLSS of the same school, Abul Hossain, an officer of Sonali Bank Kurigram branch and Rezaul Karim, another officer of the same bank.

In the case, he said, the six people at first took away nine cheques from his office in absence of him and drew Tk 13,13,691 with the help of Abul Hossain and Rezaul Karim, two officers of Sonali Bank Kurigram branch and embezzled the amount.

After investigation, the ACC submitted charge sheet against them on 4 April, 2013.

At Gangachhara, 5 metric tonnes of foodgrains of Food for Work project were embezzled at Alambiditar union under Gangachhara upazila in Rangpur district.

Later, Md. Zahirul Huda, deputy director of ACC Rangpur office, lodged a case against seven people including the upazila nirbahi officer (UNO) of Gangachhara on 27 July, 2011.

After thorough investigation, Zahirul Huda submitted the charge sheet on May 5 against six people dropping Abu Nochor Md. Abdullah, former UNO of Gangachhara upazila.

The charge sheeted accused are AKM Mizanur Rahman, former project implementation officer (PIO) of Gangachhara Sadar upazila, Asgar Ali, president of the project, Mahatab Uddin, secretary of the project, Safar Uddin, Abul Kashem and Monwara Begum, members of the project committee.

BGB member, 2 policemen buried

A member of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB), killed in a clash with Hefajat-e Islam activists at Kanchpur in Narayanganj district on Monday, was laid to rest at a graveyard in Tangail yesterday afternoon, reports our correspondent.

Earlier, the body of nayek subedar Shah Alam, 51, was taken to Kumudini Hospital ground in Mirzapur upazila by a helicopter at around 11:00am after holding his first namaz-e-janaja at the BGB headquarters in Dhaka.

He was then buried at Shovulla graveyard with state honour, said family members.

Among others, local lawmaker Ekabbar Hossain and UNO Afroza Akter Chowdhury, were present.

Shah Alam, who joined BGB in 1981, left a son and a daughter to mourn his death.

In Gopalganj, the namaz-e-janaja of two policemen, killed in a clash with Hefajat at the same place, were held at Police Lines ground Monday night.

The deceased are nayek Feroj Ahmed Khan of Faridpur district and constable Mohammad Zakaria of Gopalganj, reports a correspondent.

Among others, deputy commissioner Md Khalilur Rahman, police superintendent Md Mizanur Rahman, ASP Md Asraful Azim and officer in-charge of Sadar police station Zakir Hossain, were present at the janaja on Monday night.

The duo were laid to rest at their family graveyards yesterday morning.

Man killed by his son

A man was killed allegedly by his son at Uttar Kholeya-Hajipara village in Gangachhara upazila yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Abdul Hanif, 55. He was a day labourer.

Police and locals said Hanif rebuked his second wife Rabeya Khatun following an altercation over preparing his meal at around 2:30pm.

Angered by the incident, Rezaul Karim, son of Rabeya, hit Hanif with a bamboo stick, leaving him dead on the spot.

The body was sent to Rangpur Medical College and Hospital morgue for autopsy, said officer in-charge Prithis Kumar Sarker.

Robiul Islam, son of Hanif's first wife, filed a murder case against his stepmother Rabeya and brother Rezaul Karim in this connection.

Police already arrested Rabeya and Rezaul Karim in connection with the killing, said the OC.

Three kids drown

Three kids including two cousins drowned in villages under Daudkandi upazila yesterday. They are Siam Hossain, 5, son of Khalil Ullah and his cousin Aman Ullah, 3, son of Oli Ullah of Tamta village and two and a half year old Arif, son of Abdur Rahim of Maligaon village. Family sources said Siam and Aman drowned while they were playing beside a ditch adjacent to their residence. Meanwhile, family members found Arif's body floating in a pond near their house around 6:00pm.

During his career, he held many important positions including the posts of head of the English department and hall provost at Dhaka University.

BSF picks up youth

Indian Border Security Force (BSF) kidnapped a Bangladeshi from near Mundumala border in Baliadanga upazila early yesterday. The man was identified as Abul Hasan, 27, son of Shahed Ali of Laxmidangi village of the same upazila. Lt. Col. Abu Bakr Abu, Commanding Officer of BGB 30 Battalion, said BSF members, caught Hasan when he approached the border at about 12:30am. Later, the Indian border guards took him to their camp, said the BGB official.

Precious statue recovered

A precious statue weighing 11.645 kg was recovered at Onahuto Singarpara village under Gunahar union of Dupchachia upazila yesterday morning. Local said when labourers were digging a pond of Abdul Karim, they found the statue worth Tk 10 crore under the soil of the pond at around 8am. Abdul Karim said, after getting the 'touchstone', the labourers wanted to take it away. But he informed the UNO who later recovered the statue with the help of law enforcers.

Housewife beaten to death

A housewife was beaten to death allegedly by her husband at Machhuapara village under Pirgachha upazila yesterday noon. The deceased was identified as Khaleda Begum, 29, wife of Naimuddin of the same area and a mother of three children. Police and local sources said, Naimuddin had been reluctant to bear his family expenses for long. The couple locked in quarrels almost every day over the matters. At around 12:00pm yesterday they locked into an altercation and at one stage Naimuddin beat Khaleda up mercilessly, leaving her dead on the spot and fled away from the village.

Seven clinics sealed

A mobile court yesterday sealed seven private clinics in Hariankundu upazila town. The court also fine of Tk 35 thousand from the clinic owners when they failed to show necessary papers, physicians and nurses for treatment. The sealed clinics are Shikha Private Hospital and Diagnostic Centre, Bhai Bhai Private Hospital, Anwara Clinic, Resido Private Hospital, Janaseba Diagnostic Centre, Arafat Diagnostic Centre and Satabdi Diagnostic Centre. Jhenidah district civil surgeon Dr. Nasrin Sultana said, some local people, after the death of a patient at a clinic in Harinakundu upazila town recently, alleged that all the private clinic in the town run without full-time physician and nurse. She arranged the mobile court which raided the clinics yesterday.

Fake juice factory
