

GSP FACILITY

Dipu Moni to spur US for continuation

Foreign Minister Dipu Moni will request the US government to continue to give GSP facility to Bangladesh when she will meet US Secretary of State John Kerry in Washington on May 17 to discuss the entire range of bilateral issues.

The talks will also highlight Bangladesh government's steps to avoid the recurrence of Savar-like tragedy through creating conducive labour conditions, including health and safety provisions of factories across the country.

"Since it's my first meeting with the new secretary of state, all aspects of bilateral ties would come up, particularly the GSP facility, the tragic Savar accident, and what steps the government has undertaken to avoid such incident," she told reporters at the foreign ministry last evening.

Dipu Moni will leave for the USA on May 12 to attend a high level meeting of UN global action meeting on human trafficking on May 13. She will go to Washington from there.

During her meeting with Senator Kerry, officials said, the foreign minister might seek US assistance in repatriation of the convicted killers of Bangabandhu so that they could be brought to justice and US support for the trial of war criminals.

Meanwhile, US Ambassador at Large for War Crimes Issues Stephen J Rapp will arrive in Dhaka on May 14 to "learn" more about the International Crimes Tribunal (ICT).



Hajj Flights

Govt fixes air ticket fare for two packages

The government yesterday fixed air ticket fare for two packages, "normal" and "short", for this year's hajj pilgrims.

A pilgrim who intends to perform the ritual in 45 days under the "normal package" will have to pay US \$1475 for a return ticket while a return ticket under the newly introduced "short package" which includes 20 to 22 days' stay will cost US \$2550. However, the only package last year cost US\$1465.

The decision came at a Hajj Flight Review meeting at the civil aviation ministry.

Only 1,500 aspiring pilgrims will be able to avail the "short package" which

only includes business class tickets, said the meeting sources.

This year, the government has arranged the pilgrimage for 1.3 lakh aspiring pilgrims. Half of them will be ferried by Biman Bangladesh Airlines and the rest by flights by Saudia, the national flag carrier of Saudi Arabia.

The first hajj flight is scheduled for September 7 while the last flight will take off on October 9. The return flight will continue till November 21 from October 20.

Chaired by Civil Aviation Minister Faruk Khan, the meeting was also attended by Secretary to the ministry Khorshed Alam Chowdhury and Biman's Managing Director Kevin John Steele.

LABOUR ACT AMENDMENT SKOP to submit suggestions

Sramik Karmachari Oikya Parishad yesterday formed a 4-member subcommittee to submit their recommendations to the government for incorporating those in the upcoming amendment to the Labour Act, 2006.

The organisation held a meeting in this regard and the members elaborately discussed about the amendments of the labour act, which the cabinet approved for amendment on April 22.

The meeting also decided to abolish the post of coordinator, said a press release.

Shafi-uddin Ahmed, president of Sramik Federation of Bangladesh, was made the president of SKOP while Chowdhury Ashiqul Alam, general secretary of Bangladesh Trade Union Federation, was made member secretary. They will manage the works of SKOP for six months.

One minute silence was observed at the beginning of the meeting to pay homage to those who died in the collapse of the nine-storey Rana Plaza in Savar.

Updating asthma patients' statistics urged

Healthcare experts yesterday suggested updating the statistics of asthma patients to ensure treatment to the growing number of patients with respiratory problems in the country.

They were addressing the "17th Annual Scientific Conference on Asthma and COPD" organised by Asthma Association Bangladesh (AAB) at its auditorium in the capital's Mohakhali to mark the World Asthma Day. According to the latest statistics which was prepared in

1999, there were around 70,000 asthma patients in the country. Now, the number must have been doubled due to population growth, weather change and industrial develop-

ment, said Bangladesh Medical Association (BMA)

Knowledge about the actual number of patients is essential to provide the proper health services, said BMA Secretary General Dr M Iqbal Arsalan. AAB President Prof Mirza Mohammad Hiron and Vice

President Dr Mahmud Hasan.

President Dr Biswas Akhtar Hossain also attended the event. The World Asthma Day is observed on the first Tuesday in

May every year. This year, the theme of the day is: "You can control your asthma".

MAY 5 ATROCITIES IAB to hold rally tomorrow to protest
