

Bloggers Shuvo, Russel freed on bail

Bloggers Subrata Adhikari Shuvo and Russel Parvez were freed from jail last evening more than a month after they were arrested on charges of posting "derogatory comments about Islam and Prophet Muhammad (pbuh)" on the internet.

Forman Ali, senior superintendent of Dhaka Central Jail, told The Daily Star that Shuvo and Parvez walked out of the jail at around 6:00pm after they had received their bail orders.

Earlier in the day, a Dhaka court granted their bail prayers after a lawyer submitted petitions seeking bails for the two bloggers.

Shuvo, 24, a master's student of Dhaka University, and Russel Parvez, 36, a teacher at an English medium school, were arrested

on April 2.

Judge Md Zahirul Haque of the Dhaka

Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court, in his order, said the two bloggers had been in jail for over 45 days, adding that the charges brought against them would be settled on the basis of statements of witnesses and evidences. So they were granted bail, the judge further said.

The court, however, did not pass any order on the bail petitions submitted for two other bloggers – Asif Mohiuddin and Moshiur Rahman Biplob – as their lawyers were absent in the court yesterday.

Asif was arrested on April 3 and Moshiur on April 2 on the same charges.

The court fixed June 2 for passing order whether it will take cognizance of the charges brought against the bloggers.

Earlier on April 17, detective police submitted probe reports against four bloggers accusing them of hurting religious sentiments via social media.

cooperative dairy Milk Vita have transferred its 28 employees, including seven officers, to its different plants last week to prevent corruption and anomalies at the company, said a press release.

With this transfer, a total of 71 employees have so far been relocated in the past three months at the country's largest dairy producing farm, officially known as Bangladesh Milk Producers' Cooperative Union.

Five heavy vehicle drivers, who were kept idle at Milk Vita's Sirajganj plant, have been posted to the Mirpur plant, where two temporary employees have been sacked on charge of misconduct.

The company has sent documents about corruption in procurement and establishment of a UHT plant, a plant to make condensed milk, a can making plant and a water bottling plant during 2004 to 2007 to the Anti Corruption Commission for taking action against those who were responsible in the incidents, the release said.

educational institutions participated in the three-day long competition. TIB and SBAU jointly organised the com-


petition with the theme of resisting corruption through the spirit of youth.


