Shukharanjan Bali HC seeks media reports on detention

The High Court yesterday asked the counsel of a writ petitioner to submit to it in two weeks recent media reports on Shukharanjan Bali's detention in an Indian jail.

The order came after hearing on a writ petition claiming that law enforcers had abducted Shukharanjan, a supposed defence witness for convicted war criminal Jamaat-e-Islami leader Delawar Hossain Sayedee.

The writ said Shukharanjan was abducted from the international crimes tribunals' main entrance on November 5, 2012 and detained illegally.

Shukharanjan's friend Abul Kalam Azad filed the petition on November 7, 2012 seeking HC directives on the government to produce Shukharanjan before the court to show that he was not illegally detained. When the counsel, Abdur Razzaq, sought time, the HC

bench of Justice M Moazzam Husain and Justice Shahidul Karim asked him to place an affidavit in this regard. Abdur Razzaq told The Daily Star that, on receiving the

reports, the HC might pass an order on the legality of Shukharanjan's detention. According to recent media reports, Shukharanjan is now in a

Kolkata jail for entering India illegally. Citing BBC Bangla Service, The Daily Star on May 18 reported that Indian documents do not support the "reported" personal statement of Shukharanjan from Kolkata jail that he was

forced into Indian territory by Bangladeshi security agencies. The BBC added that there was no mention of any incident of pushing him into India.

BANGLADESH- INDIA LAND BOUNDARY AGREEMENT

Salman Khurshid seeks opposition support

Indian External Affairs Minister Salman Khurshid urged India's opposition parties to back the land boundary agreement with Bangladesh, saying "we will gain and as a nation we must do it".

"Let somebody convince me that the land boundary agreement is not in India's interest...We are urging our opposition leaders to come on board," he told senior journalists of Indian Express in an interview published vesterday.

"The reality on the ground is that when we drew our boundary, there were parts that we thought were Indian but they remain with them, there were parts that they thought were Bangladeshi but remain with us.

"...if we can't build a fence there, then the very thing you're complaining about can't come to an end, which is the infiltration of people.

"This is in India's interest. This is not in Bangladesh's interest alone. Anything that is in the interest of two friendly countries cannot and must not be described as a compromise or softness," he said.

TAZREEN FIRE HC orders arrest of owner

The High Court yesterday directed police to immediately arrest Delwar Hossain, owner of Tazreen Fashion Ltd in Ashulia, and produce him before it on May 30 to explain his stance on the November, 2012 fire in the factory that claimed 112 people's lives.

In response to a writ petition, the HC also asked the government to issue a red alert at all land ports and airports to prevent Delwar from fleeing from the country. It also issued a rule upon the government to explain in

four weeks why it should not be directed to prosecute Delwar for his alleged negligence in protecting the deceased garments workers from the fire. The HC bench of Justice Quazi Reza-Ul Hoque and

Justice ABM Altaf Hossain also asked the government to explain why its inaction to arrest Delwar should not be declared illegal.

Detectives free 49 of 53 BNP men held from jail gate

Detectives on Saturday night and early yesterday freed 49 of 53 mid-level leaders and activists of BNP and its different wings who were arrested at the Kashimpur jails' gates after they walked out on bail.

The remaining four were shown arrested in a case filed with Khilgaon Police Station over the torching of an Eagle Paribahan bus and subsequent death of its driver, Badar Ali Beg, 48, in the capital's Khilgaon on April 21, 2012.

A Dhaka court granted a two-day remand prayer for each of the four -- Md Abu Taher, 55, Eshakul Islam, 30, Mizanur Rahman, 36, and Md Liton, 35, said Detective Branch (South) of police Deputy Commissioner (DC) Jahangir Alam.

DB personnel picked up the 53 persons from Kashimpur on Saturday at 1:30pm and took them to the headquarters of the Detective Branch (DB) of police on Minto Road in the capital around 5:00pm.

Among the 53 BNP men, 35 were freed from Kashimpur Jail-1 and the remaining 18 from Kashimpur

They are among the 156 leaders and activists arrested during a drive in BNP's Nayapaltan central office in the capital on March 11.

Mollah's lawyer Abdur Razzaq told the SC that there was no legal bar for the court to apply international laws in dealing with cases related to the 1971 crimes against humanity since the offences were international in nature. He said the Nuremberg court had applied international laws and conventions. Abdur Razzaq told The Daily Star that the conviction would be cancelled if the SC applies international laws.

PADMA BRIDGE GRAFT CASE ACC team goes to Canada for investigation

An Anti-Corruption Commission officer along with its legal adviser left Dhaka for Canada yesterday to conduct an investigation in connection with Padma bridge graft allegation case.

Mirza Zahidul Alam, a deputy director of ACC, and also investigation officer of the case; and Anisul Haque, a legal adviser of ACC, are scheduled to reach Toronto, Canada today and stay there till May 23, ACC source said.

After filing of the case on December 17, the ACC is yet to complete its investigation as investigators waited for Canada's response to a request for interrogating three Canadians --Mohammad Ismail, Ramesh Shah and Kevin Wales whose names surfaced after Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) seized some documents in this regard.

The trio, also former officials of Canadian consulting firm SNC Lavalin who are reportedly involved in Padma graft conspiracy, are now facing trial in a Canadian court.

The ACC filed the case with Banani Police Station against seven persons, including former secretary of Bridges Division Mosharraf Hossain Bhuiyan.

On June 29 last year, the World Bank cancelled its \$1.2 billion funding for the project, saying it had proof of a "corruption conspiracy" involving Bangladeshi officials, executives of the Canadian firm and some

other individuals. On September 21, the global lender decided

to revive the loan after the Bangladesh government agreed to the World Bank's terms and conditions. However, the government withdrew its request for loan revival on January 31, and the

lender complied.
