Fiorentina's players and officials were furious after being deprived of a place in the Champions League playoff by two late goals from AC Milan on Sunday, who clinched third place in Serie A and qualified at their expense.

Milan, needing to beat relegated Siena to hold on to third spot, won 2-1 after equalising with a controversial penalty won and converted by Mario Balotelli before Philippe Mexes grabbed the winner.

The goals were both scored in the last six



minutes and allowed Milan to finish two points ahead of fourth-placed Fiorentina, who thrashed Pescara 5-1.

"Milan were gifted a penalty," defender Manual Pascual told the Mediaset Premium cable

channel. "It was disappointing to see the dream disappear like that. ... we believed in the

Champions League." Defender Gonzalo Rodriguez commented on Twitter: "If I say everything I

think, I won't play again in Italy." Sporting director Daniele Prade said he was not surprised by the outcome.

"We feel impotent in the face of these situations," he said. "There aren't words at the moment. We deserved a lot more, we have never been gifted anything.

"We went from euphoria to misery but I can say we had expected it. The epilogue had already been written."

Coach Vincenzo Montella tried to look on the bright side.

"We shouldn't feel bitter about this, we can finish the season with satisfaction and pride, all of us, players, staff, coaches and supporters," he said.

"We should be proud that we took Milan to the wire and that they had to clinch their place in the last minute.

"We are satisfied with our performance in the championship."

Barcelona forever

Argentine football star Lionel Messi said Monday he could not play for any team other than Barcelona, where he has been since the age of 13.

"I cannot play with any team other than Barcelona," he told reporters in Qatar, where he took part in a charity event.

But he added in answering a question about a possible transfer that he "did not know what the future hides."

Messi joined Barcelona when he was still just 13 and climbed through the Catalans' ranks, making his first team debut at just

He has gone on to win the Champions League three times with the Spanish giants as well as La Liga six times, and two Spanish Cups.

On top of that he has been named world player of the year four times in a

Despite all his personal accolades, Messi refused to accept he is indispensable to Barca, insisting, according to a translation into Arabic: "I am part of a group, and we all work to help each other."

Whilst in Doha, Messi launched a joint programme between his charity organisation and Qatari telecommunication company Ooredoo, aimed at helping children in the Middle East, North Africa and South Asia.

Frank roots for Jose

Chelsea midfielder Frank Lampard on Monday admitted he would love to work with Jose Mourinho again as reports continue to link the Real Madrid manager with a return to Stamford Bridge.

Lampard credits Mourinho with giving him the belief to become a world-class performer during their time together at Chelsea between 2004 and 2007.

Mourinho's reputation has lost some of its lustre since then and his stormy three-year spell at Real looks set to end after the Bernabeu club called a board meeting on Monday in the aftermath of Friday's Spanish Cup final defeat against Atletico Madrid.

Real have already had an approach rejected for Carlo Ancelotti, currently in charge at French champions Paris Saint-Germain, and Mourinho's exit seems only a matter of time.

Lampard, who recently signed a new one-year contract after becoming Chelsea's all-time leading scorer, remains a big admirer of Mourinho and asked what makes his former boss so successful, the England international told TalkSPORT: "It's a presence and an aura and a way with people.

"He galvanises people. His own self-confidence reflects back on his teams. He did that to me personally.

"Tactically he's fantastic. He's very astute. As a team he sets you up brilliantly.

"But what he does is he gets the best out of players and gets this togetherness that I'd never known until he came to the club and I haven't seen it again since then. "He might rub people up the wrong way. But as a man-

ager, he's brilliant with his team tactically, he's brilliant with

individuals and I think he's brilliant with the press. I know it creates a storm but he does protect his players." Mourinho's previous spell at Chelsea brought the west London team two Premier League titles, including the club's

first for 50 years, the FA Cup and the two League Cups. But the Portuguese coach departed in controversial circumstances amid claims he fell out with Blues owner

Roman Abramovich and several players. Asked if a reunion could end in tears again, Lampard

insisted he was sorry to see Mourinho leave and saw no reason why the 50-year-old couldn't be successful again.

"I wasn't fed up with it," said Lampard. "He made me believe I was better than I was at the time."

Barca close in on 100

Champions Barcelona moved a step closer to matching Real Madrid's La Liga record of 100 points with a 2-1 win over Real Valladolid, that was the prelude to a title party at the Nou Camp on Sunday.

Tito Vilanova's side wrapped up their fourth league crown in five years last weekend, but still have the chance to equal the mark set by Jose Mourinho's victorious side last season.

A 21st-minute strike from Pedro and an own-goal from Valladolid's Marc Valiente before halftime sealed a drab victory in unseasonably chilly and wet conditions in a two-thirds full stadium.
