

Villagers build their road as authorities unconcerned

Villagers of Ullah Sonatola in Saghata upazila have finally started construction of a road across the River Ullah themselves because of long indifference by the authorities concerned.

Locals said construction work of a bridge over the river came to standstill about 11 years ago.

On Saturday, the villagers started the earthwork of the road across the dried up riverbed. Cross section of people from both sides of river spontaneously joined the work.

The bridge, which connected Gaibandha-Saghata road, collapsed during a flood in 1988. Since then the hapless villagers crossed the river by boat at the time of monsoon and on foot during the dry

season.

In 2002, the Roads and Highway Department undertook the construction work of a 74.16-meter bridge at a cost of Tk 1.3 crore.

But, the work of the bridge came to a halt allegedly because of high price of construction materials, said roads and highway sources.

Later, the authorities revised the estimated cost of bridge at Tk 3.5 crore, but did not approve any fund, they said.

All our pleas to implement the work of the bridge fell on the deaf ears, alleged locals.

Finding no other alternatives, villagers joined hands to construct the road beside the bridge to ease communication, said Tajul Islam, a member of Bharatkhal union.

Missing girl found dead

Police on Wednesday recovered the body of a schoolgirl, who had gone missing on Sunday, from the Damudar River in Damudia upazila.

The deceased was identified as Kaniz Mumu Akhtar, 13, student of class VIII of Pilot Girls High School and daughter of Golam Azam of Sinan Ghat village in Madaripur district.

Police, quoting the family members, said Kaniz had remained missing since after she went out of the home after a feud with her parents over study on Sunday night.

On Tuesday, locals spotted her body on the bank of the river and informed police.

Shops gutted

Five shops were gutted in a devastating fire that broke out in Kathpatty Road area of the city on Wednesday afternoon.

Faruk Hossain Shikdar, senior fire service official, said the fire originated from an electric short circuit at an electric materials shop along the road at 4:45 pm and soon spread to the other adjoining shops, leaving five shops completely damaged.

The affected shop owners claimed that the loss from the fire would go up to Tk 2 crore.

Help for family of a hartal victim

The Optimists, a USA-based organisation, yesterday donated \$300 (equivalent to Tk 22,800) to the wife of slain truck driver Shahidul Islam Khokon.

Khokon, 35, son of Jalal Uddin of Matidali in Bogra town, was killed as the supporters of hartal enforced by the BNP-led 18-party alliance hurled brickbats at him on Dhaka-Rangpur highway at Baropur in Bogra town on April 9 this year.

The incident left Khokon's pregnant wife Mafela Begum and their eight-year-old son Abdur Rahman into utter despair. As AKM Saidul Karim, general secretary of Bangladesh chapter of The

Optimists, handed over the money to Mafela at her tinshed house at Matidali in Bogra town in presence of a few journalists and locals, tears rolled down her cheeks.

She vowed to continue schooling of her son, a Class II student of a nearby primary school.

Saidul Karim also assured the family of further help, especially for the boy's education.

The Daily Star as well as other national and local newspapers ran the tragic story of Khokon's death on April 10.

Earlier an engineer from the UAE donated around Tk 10,000 to the bereaved family.
