PAY SCALE FOR LOWER COURT JUDGES | SC accepts govt action report

The Supreme Court yesterday accepted a government report on its action of fixing a new pay scale for the lower court judges.

The finance ministry on June 2 issued a statutory regula-

tory order (SRO) on the new pay scale that set Tk 40,000 as the highest monthly salary for a senior district and session judge or an equivalent judicial officer on completion of five years of service. According to the SRO, the new pay scale will take retroac-

tive effect from July 1, 2009, and the lower court judges can receive their due salaries as arrears until May 8, 2013, but other benefits beside salaries will not be applicable in this regard.

The highest of the new six-level salary structure has now risen from Tk 35,600 to Tk 39,600.

The second level has increased from Tk 33,750 to Tk 37,000.

In the third salary level, the pay has gone up to Tk 37,000 from Tk 31,250. The fourth level is from Tk 29,700 to Tk 34,200, the fifth level is now Tk 29,200 from the former Tk 26,200, and sixth level is Tk 25,600 from Tk 20,370.

Attorney General Mahbubey Alam yesterday placed the report along with the SRO before the Appellate Division of Supreme Court, saying that the government had announced the new pay scale for judicial officers as per its April 25 order.

He submitted the report during hearing the Masdar Hossain Case popularly known as separation of judiciary case.

The attorney general also said the government was taking steps to amend the Bangladesh Judicial Service (formation of service, appointment and suspension to service post, dismissal and removal) Rules, 2007, as per the apex court's previous order.

The nine-member Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice Md Muzammel Hossain fixed July 11 for passing an order on the issue.

Three-storey building tilts in Demra

A three-storey residential building in Demra on the capital's outskirts tilted early yesterday, prompting the authorities to order its demolition.

The building gradually leaned on an adjoining six-storey building on Madrasah Road at Purba Hajinagar, and it came to the notice of people in the midnight, Afsar Uddin, an official of Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk), told The Daily Star.

"It is a non-engineered building, lacking Rajuk approval, architectural and structural designs, and soil tests," said Afsar. "We have ordered the owner to demolish it within a week."

Rajuk would write to the Narayanganj district administration to approve the demolition and sue the owner if he fails to comply, he said. The demolition is to start today, he added.

Afsar said the Narayanganj district administration officials evacuated six families, including that of the owner, and sealed off the building.

The owner, Mohammad Ali, who had lived in Kuwait for two decades, said he had the building made by the husband of his wife's sister in 2000 without Rajuk approval, as no building in the neighbourhood obtained such approval at that time.

The building's foundation soil loosened during construction of the adjoining sixstorey building, he said. "I will pull it down immediately. It's my bad luck."

The ambassadors reiterated their full support to Bangladesh's ongoing development efforts to attain a middle income country status, said a for-

eign ministry press release. They said potential investors considered Bangladesh an attractive location and a politically congenial atmosphere must prevail for foreign direct remittance to flow into

Bangladesh's thrust sectors. Talking to journalists after the meeting, Palestinian Ambassador in Dhaka Shaher Mohammad urged Bangladesh's political parties to sit and work together to solve all problems to pave the way for a

fair and peaceful election. "We call all parties to sit together...we are hopeful about a peaceful solution,"

he said.

Inclusion of new areas in law delaying polls: EC officials

The announcement of the election schedule for the bifurcated Dhaka city corporation is being delayed, as the newly delimited areas are yet to be included in the Local Government (City Corporation) Act 2009, Election Commission officials said yesterday.

The commission will announce the schedule soon after the Local Government Division (LGD) issues a gazette, amending the first schedule of the act, in which the latest delimited areas will be included, they

told journalists at the EC Secretariat. The LGD on Thursday issued a gazette, announcing the inclusion of Sultanganj union in the Dhaka South City Corporation territory.

"Sub-section-4 of Section-4 of the act will have to be amended to include the newly delimited areas," said Election Commissioner Mohammad Abdul Mobarak. "The process of completion of the task is underway. We will announce the schedule as soon as the gazette is issued."

An EC official said if the commission could announce the schedule immediately, the elections were possible by the first week of July. Or, it will take place after Eid-ul-Fitr, he added. The last Dhaka city corporation election was held in 2002. The term expired in 2007.

TOKI MURDER CASE

Why investigation not to be given to Rab

The High Court has issued a rule upon the government to explain in two weeks why it should not be directed to hand over the investigation of Tanvir Mohammad Toki murder case in Narayanganj to Rapid Action Battalion to reveal the truth behind the killing.

In response to a writ petition, the HC issued the rule on May 20, also asking the officials concerned to explain why their inaction to investigate the case should not be declared illegal. The home secretary, inspector general of police (IGP)

deputy IGP (Dhaka), superintendent of police (SP) in Narayanganj, and officer-in-charge of Narayanganj Sadar Model Police Station were made respondents to the rule. The HC bench of Justice Quazi Reza-Ul-Haque and

Justice ABM Altaf Hossain came up with the rule after hearing the writ petition filed by Rafiur Rabbi, father of Toki. About the HC order, Rafiur Rabbi said although three months had already passed, there was no visible progress in

the investigation by the agencies like police and detectives. He said he had submitted a written complaint to the Narayanganj SP, naming seven suspects, including forme lawmaker Shamim Osman and his son Ayon Osman, in connection with the murder.

SP of Narayanganj Syed Nurul Islam said they had received a copy of the HC rule from Toki's father, but they are yet to receive any official documents.

Toki was found dead on the bank of the Shitalakkhya river on March 8, two days after he went missing.
