The Sadar Model Police Station Officer-in-charge Bazlur Rashid said some children were playing football near a mosque in the area around 10:30am. They found the crude bomb in a nearby paddy field, as they went looking for the ball. They brought the bomb back out of curiosity and to show it to the others. It had exploded at that point and injured five boys and two

Wal-Mart faced renewed criticism over factory safety in Bangladesh and alleged corruption in Mexico at its shareholder meeting on Friday as it said it would buy back another \$ 15 billion of its own shares.

Investor representatives demanded better governance, citing Wal-Mart's unwillingness to join a sector accord on factory safety and unresolved Mexican bribery allegations, but their reform proposals did not win

enough votes to succeed. The meeting is also a rally-cum-concert for Wal-Mart employees and was hosted by actor Hugh Jackman. Tom Cruise appeared too, repeating Wal-Mart's messages on

Rajshahi homes get gas supply

Pashchimanchal Gas Company Limited (PGCL) started providing gas connections to consumers in the city yesterday, bringing to an end the wait of almost two decades by the locals.

Petrobangla Chairman Hossain Mansur formally opened the gas connection by lighting a burner before the house of language movement veteran Abul Hossain in the city's Seroil area at

On the first day, the authorities connected 33 consumers, including government offices, to the gas network.

"This gas will reach to all households in Rajshahi on a first-come, firstserved basis," said Mansur.

He hoped the gas connection would enrich the lifestyle of local people.

US tapping Facebook, Google, other internet firms

The National Security Agency and the FBI are tapping directly into the central servers of nine leading US Internet companies, extracting audio and video chats, photographs, e-mails, documents, and connection logs that enable analysts to track foreign targets, according to a top-secret document obtained by The Washington Post.

The programme, code-named PRISM, has not been made public until now.

The NSA prides itself on stealing secrets and breaking codes, and it is accustomed to corporate partnerships that help it divert data traffic or sidestep barriers. But there has never been a Google or Facebook before, and it is unlikely that there are richer troves of valuable intelligence than the ones in Silicon Valley.

extracts what it wants, according to the document: "Collection directly from the servers of these US Service Providers: Microsoft, Yahoo, Google, Facebook, PalTalk, AOL, Skype, YouTube, Apple."

PRISM was launched from the ashes of President George W. Bush's secret programme of warrantless domestic surveillance in 2007, after news media disclosures, lawsuits and the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court forced the president to look for new authority.






