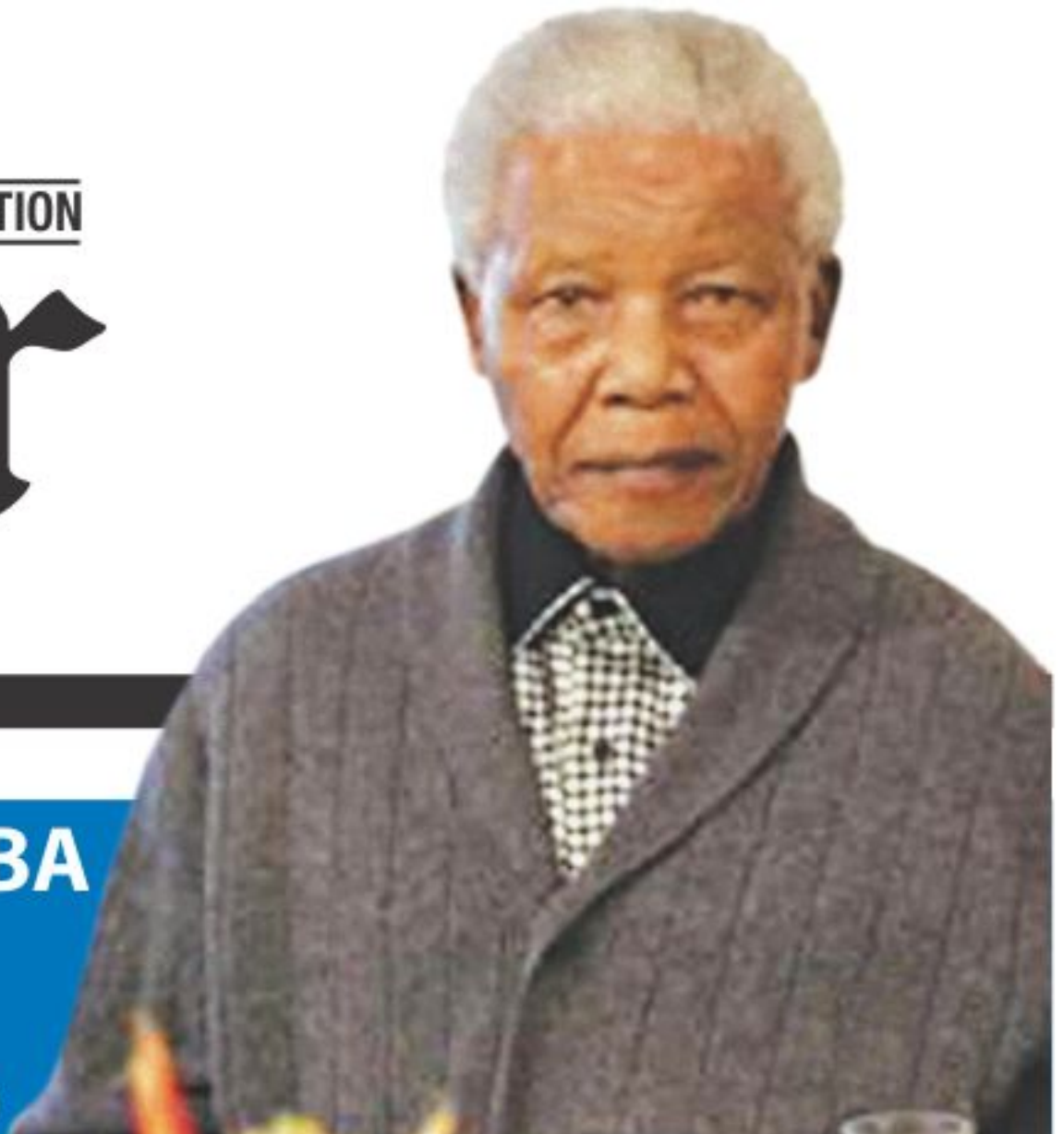

Money hardly whitens

A peek inside real estate shows how amnesty creates more black money

The demand for black money remains high in the property market, and the proposed amnesty on undisclosed money in the real estate sector will indeed generate more illegal wealth.

An investigation by The Daily Star has found that sellers generate black money when they sell property, and buyers show a much lower value of property during registration to evade tax, which eventually creates illegal money.

Take the following three cases into account to get an idea of the matter.

A person bought a 1,262-square-foot flat in an apartment block named Cordial Samela for Tk 27 lakh in south Badda last year. The person showed the price of flat around Tk 2,000 per square foot, whereas the actual price is Tk 6,000 to Tk 8,000 per square foot depending on location in the area.

Sagufa NM Housing Ltd that has a housing project in Badda said it was charging Tk 90 lakh for a 1,335-square-foot flat at a rate of Tk 7,000 a square foot. If the price of the

WAR TRIBUNAL CONTEMPT

3 leaders jailed

Jamaat calls hartal for today

International Crimes Tribunal-2 yesterday sentenced "absconding" Jamaat-e-Islami lawmaker Hamidur Rahman Azad and Jamaat acting secretary general Rafiqul Islam Khan to three months' imprisonment and fined each of them Tk 3,000 for contempt of court.

Hours after the judgement was delivered, the Jamaat called a nationwide dawn-to-dusk hartal for today.

The court also sentenced Selim Uddin, arrested assistant secretary general of Jamaat Dhaka city unit, to simple imprisonment until the court ended its session for the day, which was 12:35pm yesterday.
