ACC to probe allegations against DC Mollah Nazrul

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) will probe allegations that deputy commissioner Mollah Nazrul Islam of Detective Branch (DB) (North) of Dhaka Metropolitan Police recently extorted Tk 1 crore from a businessman, said an ACC source yesterday.

The ACC will lodge a First Information Report if the inquiry officer, ACC Deputy Director Nasim Anwar, who is supposed to submit a report within 15 days, finds any primary evidence, added the source.

News reports stated that DB Sub-inspector Hasnat and Inspector Azhar, instructed by their boss, Nazrul, picked up businessman Syed Abidul Islam, 42, from his Gulshan-1 residence on April 7 around 3:00am.

He was released after the payment, alleged Abidul's friend Kabirul Haque Mukti, Narail 1 lawmaker.

As the incident surfaced, Hasnat and Azhar were closed while Nazrul was made DC (pro-

tection) on June 1.

The DB men threatened to implicate him in false cases if he did not pay Tk 10 crore, Abidul, hailing from Narail, told The Daily Star.

Another businessman, Azzadur Rahman Mithu, Nazrul's distant relative, brought down the amount to Tk 1 crore through negotiations, he said.

On the afternoon of April 7, Abidul, Mithu, Hasnat and another man withdrew the amount from the Shantinagar branches of Standard Chartered Bank, United Commercial Bank Ltd (UCBL) and Brac Bank, added Abidul.

UCBL and Brac Bank CCIV footage showed Abidul, Mithu and Hasnat withdrawing money.

Refuting the allegation, Nazrul earlier said Mukti had a grudge against him over an incident in Narail two years ago.

Abidul, assisted by Mukti, lodged complaints with the home ministry, Police Headquarters, DB and an intelligence agency, which are now under investigation.

Against the backdrop of the June 15 Sylhet City Corporation polls, 88 out of 127 polling centres of the city's 27 wards were marked "prone to untoward incidents", stated Sylhet Metropolitan Police (SMP) yesterday.

Meanwhile, Election Commissioner Brig Gen (retd) Md Zabed Ali reached the city to oversee the election preparations and is scheduled to hold a meeting with the regional Election Commission offi-

cials today.

SMP Deputy Commissioner Ejaj Ahmed told The Daily Star that the classification was made considering the centres' previous incident records and location and police deployment in the polling centres would vary accord-

A total of 3,000 policemen, half coming in from other regions, would be deployed during the election alongside Border Guard Bangladesh, Rapid Action Battalion and Bangladesh Ansar and

Moreover, 10 teams, headed by executive magistrates, are monitoring to check whether electoral codes are being violated during election campaigns and have already issued warnings against a number of councillor candidates.

A total of 2,91,046 voters, including 1,33,865 females, would elect one from three mayoral candidates, 27 from 136 general councillor candidates and eight from 35 women's reserved seat councillor candidates.

Cops bust car thieving gang Recover 9 vehicles

Shock awaited Mohd Abdul Haque when he went to Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) in May to deposit fees for a digital numberplate for his car with the registration number Dhaka Metro Ga 12-3379.

"BRTA officials informed that someone had already paid the fee," said Haque.

After approaching Detective Branch (DB) of police, Haque found that another car recovered during a drive had the same registration, chassis and engine number as his.

"A gang of car thieves, assisted by a section of BRTA officials and brokers, first cloned documents of a registered vehicle and picture of the owner," explained DB Additional Deputy Commissioner Mohd Shahidullah, who led the drive.

They then changed the engine, chassis, registration numbers and colour of the stolen vehicle of the same model to that of the registered vehicle to sell those. "The buyer never knows he is buying a stolen car," he added.

The recovered car and a microbus were discovered in Royal Auto Care and

Servicing Centre in Kuril on April 15 following a tip-off from an employee of the gang leader and the centre owner, Mohd Ismail Hossain.

"Ismail, 37, a university graduate, and his associate Md Hanif Mridha, 32, were arrested from Banani on June 04," said Inspector Mohammad Ziaur Rahman. Based on information gleaned from the

The involved BRTA officials could not be traced yet. "However, we caught some brokers and hope to get some names from them," he added.

PROTECTING INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES' RIGHTS

NHRC chair urges govt to ratify ILO Convention 169

National Human Rights Commission Chairman Prof Mizanur Rahman yesterday stressed the need for the government to ratify Convention No 169 of International Labour Organization to protect indigenous communities' rights.

"If we can compel the state and the government to ratify the international convention and implement it, we will be able to resolve the problems centring our country's indigenous issues," he told a consultation.

The convention, a legally binding international instrument open to ratification, deals specifically with the rights of indigenous and tribal peoples. Once it ratifies the convention, a country has one year to align legislation, policies and programmes to the convention before it becomes legally binding.

A parliamentary caucus on indigenous affairs, supported by Oxfam, organised the consultation on the draft of Bangladesh

Indigenous Rights Act, 2012 in the capital's Jativa Press Club.

Referring to news report that 52 indigenous persons went missing in a February incident, presumably following factional feuds, Prof Mizanur raised questions on the government's role to rescue them.

He called upon indigenous people to remain united to protect their rights and maintain peace in Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT).

Chairing the function, the caucus President Rashed Khan Menon reiterated his demand to implement the CHT Peace Accord-1997 and to enact the law immediately to protect indigenous people's rights.

The draft act proposed to form a national commission on indigenous affairs to uphold their rights, to conserve their traditions and culture and for the overall development of indigenous people of both hill tracts and plain lands.

Journalist Abed Khan, Dhaka University Prof Mesbah Kamal and indigenous community representatives spoke at the function.






