BCB names 30-man squad for NZ series

The Bangladesh Cricket Board, in a rare move, announced a 30-member preliminary squad for the series against New Zealand -due to begin in October this

year -- almost four months before the scheduled start of the tour.

Mohammad Ashraful, who has been provisionally suspended by the BCB until the anti corruption unit's report, was not in the squad. Pacers Abul Hasan, who is recovering from a back injury and Nazmul Hossain, who recently underwent a surgery on his knee, also missed the cut. The selectors instead have put faith on some of the former regulars of the team by including the likes of batsmen Imrul Kayes, Junaed Siddiqui and Rokibul Hasan.

The squad will participate in a fitness programme which will begin at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium on June 13 and will continue till the start of the Dhaka Premier League, on July 1. The decision was taken after a meeting between the Bangladesh Cricket Board's cricket operations committee, the selection panel and the

A majority of the players for the Bangladesh A team's tour of England in August will be chosen from this squad, and some will also feature in the under-23 side that will participate in the ACC Emerging Cup in Singapore in mid-August.

Head coach Shane Jurgensen, who returned to Dhaka on Monday will head the fitness camp. Speaking to the media at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium yesterday, Jurgensen said: "The focus of the camp is something we have been wanting to do for quite a while. The focus will be purely on fitness.

"We haven't had a dedicated time for fitness in quite a while, since before the 2011 World Cup. The guys will be assessed thoroughly in light of the injuries that we have had over the last few months. We will see how strong they are, and from there we will devise programmes specific to the skill set of each player," he added.

Regarding Ashraful's involvement in fixing, he said, "There was a little bit of disbelief there. I don't know the findings of the investigations, if he's banned and he's batting well, it will be a huge loss in the batting order for us."

"I expect we get into our fitness, work hard and hopefully all the issues will settle down. We have to move on with cricket," he added.

Meanwhile, a tour of Ireland in August which was on the cards following a proposal sent by Cricket Ireland is unlikely to take place, informed BCB's cricket operations chairman Enayat Hossain Siraj. "We don't have enough players to start with. Teams will be going to England and Singapore, it's unlikely as of now," he said.

Jadeja, Dhawan power India

World Cup holders India marched into the Champions Trophy semifinals with an emphatic win over the West Indies on Tuesday that knocked arch-rivals Pakistan out of the race.

A career-best five-wicket haul by Ravindra Jadeja and a second successive century from Shikhar Dhawan lifted India to an eight-wicket victory at the packed Oval ground on a grim, overcast day in London. Mahendra Singh Dhoni's men, backed by some 22,000

largely Indian supporters at the stadium, restricted the West Indies to 233-9 and then batted fluently to surpass the target in 39.1 over. Left-hander Dhawan followed his 114 in the tournament

opener against South Africa with an unbeaten 102, reaching his second one-day hundred with a six over third man off Dwayne Bravo.

Dhawan put on 101 for the first wicket with Rohit Sharma (52) and an unbroken 109 for the third with Dinesh Karthik, who made 51 not out and smashed the winning boundary off Keiron Pollard.

India's second successive win in group B ensured them a place in the last four even before their last league match against winless Pakistan in Birmingham on Saturday.

The West Indies and South Africa, who both beat Pakistan, clash in Cardiff on Friday to determine the second semi-finalist from the group.

the West Indies slipped from 103-1 to 109-4. Left-hander Darren Bravo scored a watchful 35 off 83 balls when he attempted to loft Ashwin, missed the line and

was stumped by Dhoni to make the West Indies 140-5. Pollard, kept scoreless for the first 10 balls, opened with two consecutive sixes off Ashwin before holing out in the

deep off Ishant Sharma after making 22.

India retained the same side that defeated South Africa.

The West Indies were without wicketkeeper Denesh Ramdin, who was handed a two-match ban for claiming a dropped catch during his team's victory over Pakistan at The Oval on Friday.

The executive members of the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) are set to sit at the dugouts of their respective clubs during the matches of the upcoming Super Cup after the professional league committee yesterday lifted restriction they imposed on the executive members before the start of the season.

"We decided to lift the ban on the BFF members to enter the field after Abahani and Mohammedan applied to withdraw the restrictions," said BFF vice president and league committee chairman Abdus Salam Murshedy. BFF president Kazi Salahuddin was also present at the meeting and gave his consent to the proposal. The withdrawal of restriction means BFF executive mem-

ber Amirul Islam Babu, also manager of Mohammedan SC, executive member Satyajit Das Rupu, manager of Abahani, BFF vice president Arif Khan Joy, director of Team BJMC, BFF vice president Tabith M Awal, patron of Feni Soccer Club, can now accompany their respective clubs during any matches.

However, it has been learnt that except for Abahani and Mohammedan, the other clubs had no intention of lifting up the restriction while Sheikh Russel KC president gave a note of descent on the proposal.

Mentionable here that an unprecedented incident occurred during the Federation Cup quarterfinal this year when BFF vice president and BJMC official Arif Khan Joy entered the field with a firearm during the interval and threatened the referees.

The meeting decided to hold the players transfer for the next season from august 16 to September 30 for the local players and August 16 to November 15 for foreign players while the meeting also kept the foreign players' quota unchanged with four players eligible to play in a match against seven registrations.

BFF members in Mohammedan not too optimistic

The Motijheel outfit initially wanted to skip the Super Cup due to unavailability of players but later changed their mind, and managed to assemble players at the eleventh hour.

Coach Saiful Bari Titu will have a number of issues to deal with, including fitness concern over some of the players, row over the unpaid wages and manage a host of players were alleged by the club to have given up a match against Feni Soccer. Titu decided to keep mum on the issue.

However, the club's assistant manager Imtiaz Ahmed Nakib is hopeful that Mohammedan are still capable of winning the Super Cup which they surrendered to Abahani two years ago.

"If you look back at past, some quality foreign players made the difference in every matches but this time all teams are almost equal without the presence of those foreign players. We have some promising young players, who can change the fate of the game and I am hopeful that Mohammedan can win the Super Cup," said the

former national striker.

Meanwhile, Team BJMC have set a target of reaching the final, banking on a squad which is a mixture of youth and experience.

"Despite having only two foreign players in the starting eleven, we won the last three league matches this season, which is encouraging us to perform well in the Super Cup," said BJMC coach Jakarai Babu.

The Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) has officially signed up Dutch coaches Lodewijk De Kruif and Rene Koster for a twoyear period which will come into effect from July 1, informed BFF vice president Kazi Nabil yesterday.

"We have signed the contract papers with Lodewijk De Kruif and Rene Koster for a two-year period today (Tuesday) and sent it to them," said Nabil, who is also chairman of the National Teams Committee.

Before their official job starts in July, Kruif and Koster are scheduled to arrive in the capital on Thursday to watch the group stage matches of the Super Cup in a bid to pick up the players for the national team for September's SAFF Championship.

"Both of them will arrive in Dhaka on June 13 and watch 10 matches of Super Cup from June 14 to 18. They will leave Dhaka on the night of June 18 for their family engagement before returning to take charge of the national team from July 1," said Nabil.
