Daunting Russel in Brothers' way

They narrowly avoided relegation in the league and did not make the last four of either the Federation or Independence Cup, but Brothers Union are dreaming big when they take on treble-winners Sheikh Russel KC in the first semifinal of the Super Cup today.

The game gets underway at 6:00pm with state-owned Bangladesh Television beaming the match live from the Bangabandhu National Stadium.

With a side based around youth, Brothers Union put up a spirited showing in the group stages to overcome mighty opponents like Sheikh Jamal, Team BJMC and Mohammedan to ensure their first semifinal appearance in the Super Cup since 2009.

"Actually we wanted Sheikh Russel in the semifinal because we have some

special plan with them," Brothers coach Mahidur Rahman Miraz said. "If the boys can play accordingly like they performed in the last three matches, then we can hope to reach the final."

"After qualifying for the Super Cup as the last team, we have nothing to lose at this stage but we are committed to bring back some of Brothers' past glory. Our first target to advance to the semifinal has been fulfilled and we are still on the right direction," said Miraz at the official pre-match briefing at the BFF House yesterday.

With a 30-member team, rotation has been Brothers' biggest strength but they will still rely on the young players like hitman Jewel Rana, who struck three in two matches, winger Yusuf Sifat, Rubel Mia, Komol Islam and Mahbubur Rahman Titu.

Despite this, Sheikh Russel are still firm favourites and they will look to complete a unique quadruple after already winning the Federation Cup, Independence Cup and Bangladesh

Premier League. They are understandably confident of victory over an opposition they have beaten thrice this season already; each time after coming from a goal down.

"We want to maintain the consistency what we showed throughout the season and ensure the final berth of the Super Cup," said Sheikh Russel coach Maruful Haque, who however termed Brothers a good side with the inclusion of some young players from the Bangladesh Championship League.

"They deserved this spot as they put behind second, third and fourth sides of the league table but we are ready to face them," said Maruf, who may have some worries with his backline after stopper Mamum Mia was sent off in the last match.

"Weakness in backline is a problem but there is nothing to be worried rather I have a problem in finishing line-up and I will work on it today (Thursday)," said the successful coach.

It's India v England

World champions India outplayed Sri Lanka in all departments of the game on Thursday to advance to the final of the Champions Trophy against hosts England.

After restricting Sri Lanka to 181 for eight from their 50 overs under the floodlights on a gloomy Cardiff day, India eased to an eight-wicket victory with 15 overs to spare.

The final will be staged at Edgbaston in Birmingham this Sunday.

Shikhar Dhawan, the tournament's top scorer before Thursday's semifinal with 264 runs including two centuries, cut loose again when India set off in pursuit of the modest target.

Dhawan passed 50 for the third time in the tournament off 73 balls with six fours and a six. He survived three dropped catches to reach 68 when he was stumped by Kumar Sangakkara off leg-spinner Jeevan Mendis with victory already assured.

Virat Kohli (58 not out) then took charge, hitting a six to reach his half-century, as India romped to victory before a noisy crowd of predominantly Indian supporters.

Sri Lanka needed Lasith Malinga to produce something special if they were to have any hope of beating the form team of the

tournament.

But the Indian batsmen know all about the Sri Lanka strike bowler, playing against him regularly in the Indian Premier League, and before Thursday his wickets against India had cost 40.88 runs each.

The two teams have played each other 45 times in the past five years and India, who beat Sri Lanka in the 2011 World Cup final in Mumbai, have now won seven of their last eight games against their Asian rivals.

Dhawan should have been out twice on 18 caught off Nuwan Kulasekara. Sri Lanka captain Angelo Mathews dropped the left-hander diving to his right at first slip. Sangakkara, standing up to the stumps to the medium pacer, then missed a thin outside edge.

Mathews top-scored for Sri Lanka with a battling 51 from 89 deliveries after his opposite number MS Dhoni had opted to field under heavy cloud cover with moisture in the air following a 30-minute rain delay.

Dhoni set attacking fields throughout and even relinquished his wicketkeeping kit after the 22nd over to bowl his medium-pacers. In 222 previous one-day internationals Dhoni had bowled only two overs.

Dinesh Karthik, also a specialist wicketkeeper, took over from Dhoni who won an lbw decision against Mahela Jayawardene with his second delivery.

Siddikur in tenth spot

After the near-miss in Queen's Cup, Bangladesh's ace golfer Siddikur Rahman had a mixed bag in the opening round of the Worldwide Holdings Selangor Masters in Malaysia yesterday.

Siddikur hit an eagle in the sixth hole and was looking good with a birdie against a bogey in the first half of the day. But he lost the way a bit in the second session, hitting three more bogeys against two birdies to finish the day at 1-under-par 70 to share the crowded tenth position with eight other players.

The 28-year-old, who had a one shot lead going into the final round in the Queen's Cup earlier this week, suffered a stunning collapse and eventually finished sixth after a 6-over-par in the last round in Thailand.

Thailand's Pariya Junhasavasdikul stormed into the lead with a five-under-par 66 with eight birdies against one bogey and a double bogey at a sunbaked Seri Selangor Golf Club to lead by one from Korea's Baek Seuk-hyun in the 400,000-dollar tournament.

Rahmatullah panel wins BHF elections

The election commission of the Bangladesh Hockey Federation polls yesterday declared the Khaza Rahmatullah panel, backed by Abahani and Usha KC, as unopposed winners for a four-year stint.

"On the last day of nomination withdrawal, five vice presidents, one general secretary, three joint secretaries and 25 other candidates withdrew their nominations and the following candidates have been primarily declared winners unopposed as there were no additional candidates than the required posts," said a National Sports Council circular yesterday.

On Wednesday, the Sajed-Munir panel pulled out of the elections citing the unethical, unlawful practice.

Taskin to go to Australia

The main attraction, however, will be in Dhaka with the procession starting at 6.40am from the Ramna National Tennis Complex and end at the Bangabandhu National Stadium.



If marrying is the beginning of a new innings in a cricketer's life, then Tamim Iqbal is padding up today. And the opening Bangladesh batsman's partner at the non-striker's end is Ayesha Siddiqa, a bachelor in business administration. And their eight-year relationship is getting public with the gaye holud programme and the wedding ceremony, today and tomorrow, in Chittagong.

Then comes the walima, the grand reception, on the 27th of June at the Golf Garden of Army Golf Club and this is how one of the country's biggest stars will start his new innings.

But before all this is a Mezban, a traditional public feast of Chittagong, which was held yesterday in memory of the late members of the Khan family including the left-handed batsman's father Iqbal Khan.

Tamim has invited around 10,000 guests from all walks of life. The invitees include the prime minister and the leader of the opposition. In short it is an occasion which has taken the centre stage in the sports fraternity -- a stark contrast to the muted affair that was the wedding of Tamim's good friend and the world's best all-rounder, Shakib Al Hasan.

"Many wrote that I'm spending Tk 2.50 crore for the programme but it's not true," Tamim told with a laugh when he was talking with The Daily Star Sport yesterday. But the left-hander made it clear that he didn't leave any stone unturned to make the occasion memorable because he has very simple philosophy in his life: "earn money to spend."

Tamim is well-known for his good taste and he drives a luxury BMW, one of his first acquisitions after making it big as a cricket player. He is also often seen using the most fashionable cell phones and posh brand items. For his wedding shopping, Tamim made a detour in Dubai upon his return from the Zimbabwe tour. "The

"I was not a starter when we fell in love eight years back and she has little interest in cricket. So one thing is very clear; she loves Tamim the person, not Tamim Iqbal the cricketer," continued the 24-year-old.
